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Introduction

The Doctrine and Covenants is a book of scripture containing the writings of prophets of God in modern times. It consists of several divine revelations and inspired declarations, most of which were received between 1820 and 1844 through Joseph Smith, the first prophet and president of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Other portions were issued by later presidents of the Church (see sections 135, 136, and 138, as well as Official Declarations 1 and 2). The Doctrine and Covenants is a standard work of the Church and contains many vital doctrines and revealed principles that are important for all God's children today.

Summary

The Lord gave these revelations in order to ___ re-establish his Church, and gather into it all those willing to hear and obey his will. He appeared to Joseph Smith in 1820 (see JS-H 1:16-20) and over time prepared him for the task of restoring the gospel, part of which involved translating an ancient record called the Book of Mormon. The Lord also sent various angels to give Joseph Smith priesthood authority, which is the permission to act in God's behalf and perform sacred ceremonies such as baptism (see D&C 13; 27:12; 110; 128:18, 20-21). In 1830, at the Lord's instruction, Joseph Smith organized Jesus Christ's church so that, for the first time in centuries, there was once again a divinely authorized means of teaching the gospel and administering the ordinances necessary for salvation (see D&C 20). More of this early history can be read at Joseph Smith—History.

As the Lord gathered believers into his Church, he continued to provide guidance and revelations to his people, many of which have been included in the Doctrine and Covenants. This book does not, however, include a historical narrative that explains the events that were occurring when each section was given. Such an understanding of the overarching events can orient readers and aid them in understanding individual passages, so a very brief outline follows.

Under divine direction, in 1829 Joseph Smith translated the Book of Mormon and received priesthood authority in rural New York state. Several months after forming the Church of Jesus Christ in 1830, the Lord commanded the members (the "saints") to "go to the [state of] Ohio" (D&C 38:32), which they began to do at the beginning of 1831. Later that year, he revealed another gathering place in Missouri, "the place for the city of Zion" (D&C 57:1–3). These regions remained the two geographical centers of the Church for the next seven years, until internal disaffection and external persecution caused the saints to abandon Ohio for Missouri in 1838. Further mistreatment drove the saints to relocate to Illinois in 1839, where Joseph Smith continued to lead the Church until he was murdered in 1844. Under his successors, the saints began migrating to the west in 1847 and settled in the Rocky Mountains, where the Church continued to grow and spread across the world (see Appendix 4: Timelines).

Throughout these years of repeated relocation, the Lord continued to reveal divine doctrines and timely commandments on a variety of subjects, including the nature of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; the purpose of pain and mortal life; the sinlessness of little children; the existence and workings of Satan; the freedom of all people to choose good or evil; the effects of sin and the necessity of Jesus Christ's atoning sacrifice; the ordinances required for salvation, such as baptism; the mission and organizational structure of the Church; forming a covenant community, Zion; the construction and purpose of temples; rejecting selfish and materialistic tendencies by consecrating our blessings and resources to serve others; the active roles the Holy Ghost plays in people's lives; making inspired refinements to the Bible and receiving additional scripture beyond it; the return of Jesus Christ to reign righteously over a glorified earth; the bodily resurrection of mankind and the final Judgment and accountability for our choices, and the eternal nature of marriage and family.

Publication

The first compilation of these revelations was published in 1833 and entitled *A Book of Commandments for the Government of the Church of Christ*. Since then, several more editions have been published, many times with additional revelations that had been received or canonized since the previous edition (see Appendix 1: Testimony of the Twelve Apostles). The text of this edition comes from the Church's authorized text as found on its website.

By convention, each section is numbered. This numerical sequence places the sections in roughly chronological order, but because of complexities in the publication history, there are a few section numbers that are out of chronological order (as can be seen by reading the date of reception

under the title for each section). This edition has kept all sections in numerical order, with one exception: section 133 has been placed at the end of the book because it was originally intended to be an appendix, or concluding summary. See "Using the Structured Edition" and Appendixes 2 and 3 for guidance in understanding the chronology of the sections. While the dates of reception are largely correct, they are based on occasionally incomplete records and are thus subject to slight revision as research continues to come forth (e.g., see D&C 74).

As with other books of scripture, people who read the Doctrine and Covenants sincerely and prayerfully will come to know of its truth and applicability to their lives. It is an important testimony of the divine mission of Jesus Christ, his gracious plan to grant us eternal life, and the saving role of his Church and his prophets in the last days.

USING THE STRUCTURED EDITION

The purpose of the Structured Edition of the scriptures is to portray the inherent textual organization of the various books in the standard works of the Church. Through various typographical features, the intent has been to visually reinforce and highlight the original authors' outline and structure. Hopefully this enables readers, especially new-comers, to quickly orient themselves and more readily glean insights and spiritual principles when reading the scriptures.

The scriptural text itself has not been altered; it is identical to the standard authorized text published by the Church. Changes have only been made through adjusting the layout or the non-scriptural text such as headings or verse numbers. Several features have been used to illustrate the scriptures' organization, which are explained below (for a brief summary, see Figure 1: Features of the Structured Edition).

Conventional chapters and verses

The original authors of the scriptures did not use chapter or verse numbers; they were added later—in many cases, centuries later. They can be very useful in locating specific passages, so they have been included here. The text itself is set in paragraphs, ignoring verse breaks, but the verse numbers are superscripted inline with the rest of the text (e.g., ¹⁶). In the Doctrine and Covenants, section numbers and official declaration numbers can be seen in large faded numerals behind the title heading of each section. The running footers at the bottom of the page contain references to quickly locate passages or see what verses are found on each page.

Footnotes

Footnotes were generally limited to instances where the writer seems to expect the reader to know or recall something mentioned elsewhere in the text. Examples include prophecies or promises and their fulfillments; commandments and cases where they are obeyed or disobeyed; the source of a quote, reference, or allusion; previous events which the writer explictly refers to; etc. For a key to the abbreviations used throughout the footnotes, see Figure 2: Abbreviations and Textual Conventions.

Poetry

Various scripture editions use differing (and in some ways admittedly subjective) criteria for when a passage should be considered poetry, and thus set in poetic lines. In the Structured Edition, generally speaking, passages were set as poetry when there was clear, extended parallelism or rhetorical structure, and when doing so contributed to, and did not detract from, making the larger literary structure evident (e.g., the chiastic element of D&C 76:89–98).

Heading divisions


Multiple levels of headings have been added to help readers keep track of the context of each passage. The various heading levels illustrate major and minor divisions in the structure of a book, which can be seen perhaps most clearly in the table of contents. The highest levels of headings are also referenced at the top of each page, much like the title of a chapter in a novel. In the Doctrine and Covenants, each section or declaration has been given a title based on its content.

Colored dialogue

Whenever a person speaks or quotes someone else, the scriptural text is colored. This can help readers know at a glance whether a spoken passage will last for two sentences or two pages. It also helps, when looking up a specific verse, to remind the reader of the context—who is speaking, and to whom. In cases where multiple speakers are interacting (such as one prophet quoting another, or the Lord conversing with several people), multiple colors are used. Apart from cases where exceptions are necessary in order to portray a complex spoken exchange, the colors are generally used in the following ways:

- **Divine beings** (God the Father, Jesus Christ, or angels) are indicated with blue text. **A divine being quoting another diving being** is indicated with light blue text (e.g., Jesus Christ quoting the Father).
- **Prophets** (or other kinds of representatives or servants of God) are indicated with green text. **A prophet quoting another prophet** is indicated with light green text (e.g., Peter quoting Moses).
- Miscellaneous speakers are indicated with red text. A miscellaneous speaker quoting another miscellaneous speaker is indicated with light red text (e.g., ___).

And who receiveth you receiveth me; and you shall have power to declare my word in the demonstration of my Holy Spirit. And who receiveth you as a little child, receiveth my kingdom; and blessed are they, for they shall obtain mercy. And whoso rejecteth you shall be rejected of my Father and his house; and you shall cleanse your feet in the secret places by the way for a testimony against them. And behold, and lo, I come quickly to judgment, to convince all of their ungodly deeds which they have committed against me, as it is written of me in the volume of the book.

"And now, verily I say unto you, that it is not expedient that you should go until your children are provided for, and sent up kindly unto the bishop of Zion." This scheme is only generally applicable, though, and there are plenty of exceptions (e.g., when two miscellaneous people are speaking to each other). The main purpose of using different colors is to show when the speaker changes; the color key above should never be taken as a doctrinal interpretation.

Shaded boxes

Occasionally the writer of a scriptural book will pause their message in order to explain an idea or recount an earlier event. These digressions have been placed in shaded boxes to help readers see how long they last and, once the digression comes to an end, quickly review what was happening before the digression began.

Topical digressions (explanations) are red. These are often used to help make sense of long, complex sentences that temporarily deviate from the original thought (e.g., D&C 84:5-32).

Chronological digressions (flashbacks or flashforwards) are yellow. These boxes are used to show when a section or passage comes out of chronological order (e.g., D&C 1; 102:30–32).

Geographical shifts (travels) are blue. These boxes are used when a section was received at a different location than the surrounding sections. For example, sections 2–40 were mostly received in New York state, but sections 3–13 were received in Pennsylvania.

Nested digressions of the same type (e.g., a flashback within a flashback) are white (e.g., D&C 68:16–21). Many chronological digressions could also technically be considered geographical shifts, of course, but they are only set in a yellow box (e.g., D&C 137).

Chronology markers

When the section numbers were assigned to the individual revelations printed in the Doctrine and Covenants, because of incomplete historical records and other reasons, some of the sections were numbered out of their chronological order. Likewise, several sections overlap in both time and content with the historical narrative found in Joseph Smith—History. If readers desire to read the standard works in chronological order, they can follow the chronology markers which are placed to the right of

the text whenever an alternate sequence is possible. There are three kinds of markers:



To. Indicating a "jumping off point" to follow the narrative into another passage. For example, at the end of chronological digressions such as D&C 99 (leading to section 84).



From. Indicating a "landing point" that comes from some other passage. For example, at the beginning of chronological digressions such as D&C 99 (coming from section 83).



Interlude. Indicating a point of both departure and return, for momentarily leaving the current narrative in order to follow a "detour" and then come back. For example, at the end of D&C 83 (leading to section 99, which then returns to the same point from which it left).

A chronology marker's insertion point is at the beginning or ending of the paragraph it is attached to.

In the Doctrine and Covenants, the chronology markers are used in conjunction with Joseph Smith—History and the Articles of Faith to allow people to read the three books together in chronological order. The proper sequence is summarized in the diagram found in Appendix 2: Chronological Reading Map.

Parallel passage bars

Sometimes two separate passages have strong similarities, in some cases being nearly identical. When two passages are long enough and have sufficient similarities to each other, they are considered "parallel passages," and a vertical bar is placed at the far right of the text with references to the other passage (e.g., D&C 45:16–46). These parallel passage bars are also used for lengthy quotations (e.g., 2 Ne. 12–24). Different colors are used for the bars mainly to distinguish one from the other. In the footnotes, references to a set of parallel passages are separated by a slash (e.g., Matt. 4:1–11 / Luke 4:1–13).

Timelines

Near the beginning of each major division (like "chapters" in a novel) is a timeline depicting when the various revelations were received. Most of the section numbers are grey, but the red section numbers are those sections found in that timeline's "chapter," or time period. Sections whose exact day is uncertain are italicized, and those whose exact month is uncertain

Some references contain an apostrophe; the apostrophe indicates that the preceding number is the last verse in its chapter, or the last chapter in its book. For example, the reference $Ps.\ 23:4-6$ ' means "Psalm 23, from verse 4 to the end of the psalm." Likewise, you can tell from the reference $Mark\ 11-16$ ' that the book of Mark has a total of 16 chapters.

References separated by a slash are parallel passages (e.g., Matt. 4:1-11 / Luke 4:1-13).

are light red. Blue section numbers are those sections which were received in that same time frame, but whose numbering places them in other parts of the volume (sections 1, 74, 99, the second half of 107, 133, 134, and 137). These "highly unchronological" section numbers are also colored blue in the table of contents.

Conclusion

When applying all these features, in some cases there were two or more possible ways of interpreting the text. For example, some passages do not lend themselves easily to being subdivided by headings; in some cases it is unclear when a speaker has stopped talking or a topical digressions has ended; some shorter passages could be considered parallels but have not been marked as such, and the minimum length requirement is admittedly a bit subjective. All of these features were applied in an attempt to discern and portray the original author's intent in a way that is clear to readers, but errors are surely present. Ultimately, such features cannot replace a detailed study of the scriptural text itself.

As stated, the goal of this edition is to let the authors's textual organization speak for itself (or, to draw attention to that organization through typographical features), while avoiding interpreting the text as much as possible. Of course, as soon as an editor begins drawing boundaries between passages and naming them, a degree of interpretation begins, however small. However, since the chapter and verse breaks of traditional editions also implicitly involve some interpretation as well, the features of this edition do not introduce interpretation where none existed before. Rather, they offer an alternative framework to the one that already existed. Both frameworks are best used when treated as a window to the text itself, which is more important than the formatting surrounding it. In other words, just as readers sometimes need to ignore traditional chapter and verse breaks in order to gain an insight about the text, they may occasionally need to do the same with the features of the Structured Edition.

Someone else combing through the text to put in their own paragraph breaks and headings might choose different divisions and different phrasing. Such discrepancies are not problems, but rather fascinating starting points from which to launch a vibrant discussion about the scriptures. My hope is that this exercise of organizing the scriptural text be used as a conversation-starter about the Lord's words, to get people "speaking of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, when thou liest down, and when thou risest up" (Deut. 11:19).

Hearken, O ye people of my church, saith the voice of him who dwells on high, and whose eyes are upon all men; yea, verily I say: Hearken ye people from afar; and ye that are upon the islands of the sea, listen together. ²For verily the voice of the Lord is unto all men, and there is none to escape; and there is no eye that shall not see, neither ear that shall not hear, neither heart that shall not be penetrated. ³And the rebellious shall be pierced with much sorrow; for their iniquities shall be spoken upon the housetops, and their secret acts shall be revealed. ⁴And the voice of warning shall be unto all people, by the mouths of my disciples, whom I have chosen in these last days. ^a ⁵And they shall go forth and none shall stay them, for I the Lord have commanded them.

⁶Behold, this is mine authority, and the authority of my servants, and my preface unto the book of my commandments, which I have given them to publish unto you, O inhabitants of the earth. ⁷Wherefore, fear and tremble, O ye people, for what I the Lord have decreed in them shall be



The works, and the designs, and the purposes of God cannot be frustrated, neither can they come to naught. For God doth not walk in crooked paths, neither doth he turn to the right hand nor to the left, neither doth he vary from that which he hath said, therefore his paths are straight, and his course is one eternal round. Remember, remember that it is not the work of God that is frustrated, but the work of men; For although a man may have many revelations, and have power to do many mighty works, yet if he boasts in his own strength, and sets at naught the counsels of God, and follows after the dictates of his own will and carnal desires, he must fall and incur the vengeance of a just God upon him.

⁶Behold, you have been entrusted with these things, but how strict were your commandments; and remember also the promises which were made to you, if you did not transgress them. ^a ⁶And behold, how oft you have transgressed the commandments and the laws of God, and have gone on in the persuasions of men. ⁷For, behold, you should not have feared

man more than God. Although men set at naught the counsels of God, and despise his words— ⁸Yet you should have been faithful; and he would have extended his arm and supported you against all the fiery darts of the adversary; and he would have been with you in every time of trouble.

⁹Behold, thou art Joseph, and thou wast chosen to do the work of the Lord, but because of transgression, if thou art not aware thou wilt fall. ¹⁰But remember, God is merciful; therefore, repent of that which thou hast done which is contrary to the commandment which I gave you, and thou art still chosen, and art again called to the work; ¹¹Except thou do this, thou shalt be delivered up and become as other men, and have no more gift.

¹²And when thou deliveredst up that which God had given thee sight and power to translate, thou deliveredst up that which was sacred into the hands of a wicked man, ¹³Who has set at naught the counsels of God, and has broken the most sacred promises which were made before God, and has depended upon his own judgment and boasted in his own wisdom. ¹⁴And this is the reason that thou hast lost thy privileges for a season— ¹⁵For thou hast suffered the counsel of thy director to be trampled upon from the beginning.

¹⁶Nevertheless, my work shall go forth, for inasmuch as the knowledge of a Savior has come unto the world, through the testimony of the Jews, even so shall the knowledge of a Savior come unto my people—¹⁷And to the Nephites, and the Jacobites, and the Josephites, and the Zoramites, through the testimony of their fathers—¹⁸And this testimony shall come to the knowledge of the Lamanites, and the Lemuelites, and the Ishmaelites, who dwindled in unbelief because of the iniquity of their fathers, whom the Lord has suffered to destroy their brethren the Nephites, because of their iniquities and their abominations. ¹⁹And for this very purpose are these plates preserved, which contain these records—that the promises of the Lord might be fulfilled, which he made to his people;^a ²⁰And that the Lamanites might come to the knowledge of their fathers, and that they might know the promises of the Lord, and that they may believe the gospel and rely upon the merits of Jesus Christ, and be glorified through faith in his name, and that through their repentance they might be saved.

I, the Lord, am God, and have given these things unto you, my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., and have commanded you that you should stand as a witness of these things; ³And I have caused you that you should enter into a covenant with me, that you should not show them except to those persons to whom I commanded you; and you have no power over them except I grant it unto you. ⁴And you have a gift to translate the plates; and this is the first gift that I bestowed upon you; and I have commanded that you should pretend to no other gift until my purpose is fulfilled in this; for I will grant unto you no other gift until it is finished.

⁹Behold, verily I say unto you, I have reserved those things which I have entrusted unto you, my servant Joseph, for a wise purpose in me, and it shall be made known unto future generations; ¹⁰But this generation shall have my word through you;

¹⁷And in addition to your testimony, the testimony of three of my servants, whom I shall call and ordain, unto whom I will show these things,^b and they shall go forth with my words that are given through you. ¹²Yea, they shall know of a surety that these things are true, for from heaven will I declare it unto them.^c ¹³I will give them power that they may behold and view these things as they are; ¹⁴And to none else will I grant this power, to receive this same testimony among this generation, in this the beginning of the rising up and the coming forth of my church out of the wilderness^d—clear as the moon, and fair as the sun, and terrible as an army with banners.^e

¹⁵And the testimony of three witnesses will I send forth of my word.^f And behold, whosoever believeth on my words, them will I visit with the manifestation of my Spirit; and they shall be born of me, even of water and of the Spirit—¹⁷And you must wait yet a little while, for ye are not yet ordained^g—¹⁸And their testimony shall also go forth unto the condemnation of this generation if they harden their hearts against them;

tell you these things, even as I also told the people of the destruction of Jerusalem;^a and my word shall be verified at this time as it hath hitherto been verified.^b

Commandments

²¹And now I command you, my servant Joseph, to repent and walk more uprightly before me, and to yield to the persuasions of men no more; ²²And that you be firm in keeping the commandments wherewith I have commanded you; and if you do this, behold I grant unto you eternal life, even if you should be slain.^c

²³And now, again, I speak unto you, my servant Joseph, concerning the man that desires the witness— ²⁴Behold, I say unto him, he exalts himself and does not humble himself sufficiently before me; but if he will bow down before me, and humble himself in mighty prayer and faith, in the sincerity of his heart, then will I grant unto him a view of the things which he desires to see. ²⁵And then he shall say unto the people of this generation: Behold, I have seen the things which the Lord hath shown unto Joseph Smith, Jun., and I know of a surety that they are true, for I have seen them, for they have been shown unto me by the power of God and not of man.

²⁸And now, except he humble himself and acknowledge unto me the things that he has done which are wrong, and covenant with me that he will keep my commandments, and exercise faith in me, behold, I say unto him, he shall have no such views, for I will grant unto him no views of the things of which I have spoken. ^{d29}And if this be the case, I command you, my servant Joseph, that you shall say unto him, that he shall do no more, nor trouble me any more concerning this matter. ³⁰And if this be the case, behold, I say unto thee Joseph, when thou hast translated a few more pages thou shalt stop for a season, even until I command thee again; then thou mayest

³²And now, because I foresee the lying in wait to destroy thee, yea, I foresee that if my servant Martin Harris humbleth not himself and receive a witness from my hand, that he will fall into transgression; ³³And there are many that lie in wait to destroy thee from off the face of the earth; and for this cause, that thy days may be prolonged, I have given unto thee these commandments. ³⁴Yea, for this cause I have said: Stop, and stand still until I command thee, and I will provide means^a whereby thou mayest accomplish the thing which I have commanded thee. ³⁵And if thou art faithful in keeping my commandments, thou shalt be lifted up at the last day. Amen.

¹A great and marvelous work is about to come forth unto the children of men. ²Behold, I am God; give heed unto my word, which is quick and powerful, sharper than a two-edged sword, to the dividing asunder of both joints and marrow; therefore give heed unto my words. ³Behold, the field is white already to harvest; therefore, whoso desireth to reap, let him thrust in his sickle with his might, and reap while the day lasts, that he may treasure up for his soul everlasting salvation in the kingdom of God. ⁴Yea, whosoever will thrust in his sickle and reap, the same is called of God. ⁵Therefore, if you will ask of me you shall receive; if you will knock it shall be opened unto you.

⁶Now, as you have asked, behold, I say unto you, keep my commandments, and seek to bring forth and establish the cause of Zion; ⁷Seek not for riches but for wisdom, and behold, the mysteries of God shall be unfolded unto you, and then shall you be made rich. Behold, he that hath eternal life is rich.

¹⁰Behold thou hast a gift, and blessed art thou because of thy gift. Remember it is sacred and cometh from above— ¹¹And if thou wilt inquire, thou shalt know mysteries which are great and marvelous; therefore thou shalt exercise thy gift, that thou mayest find out mysteries, that thou mayest bring many to the knowledge of the truth, yea, convince them of the error of their ways. ¹²Make not thy gift known unto any save it be those who are of thy faith. Trifle not with sacred things. ¹³If thou wilt do good, yea, and hold out faithful to the end, thou shalt be saved in the kingdom of God, which is the greatest of all the gifts of God; for there is no gift greater than the gift of salvation.

¹⁴Verily, verily, I say unto thee, blessed art thou for what thou hast done; for thou hast inquired of me, and behold, as often as thou hast inquired thou hast received instruction of my Spirit. If it had not been so, thou wouldst not have come to the place where thou art at this time. ¹⁵Behold, thou knowest that thou hast inquired of me and I did enlighten thy mind; and now I tell thee these things that thou mayest know that thou hast been enlightened by the Spirit of truth; ¹⁶Yea, I tell thee, that thou mayest know that there is none else save God that knowest thy thoughts and the intents of thy heart. ¹⁷I tell thee these things as a witness unto thee—that the words or the work which thou hast been writing are true.

¹⁸Therefore be diligent; stand by my servant Joseph, faithfully, in what-soever difficult circumstances he may be for the word's sake. ¹⁹Admonish him in his faults, and also receive admonition of him. Be patient; be sober; be temperate; have patience, faith, hope and charity. ²⁰Behold, thou art Oliver, and I have spoken unto thee because of thy desires; therefore treasure up these words in thy heart. Be faithful and diligent in keeping the commandments of God, and I will encircle thee in the arms of my love. ²¹Behold, I am Jesus Christ, the Son of God. I am the same that came unto mine own, and mine own received me not. I am the light which shineth in darkness, and the darkness comprehendeth it not.

²²Verily, verily, I say unto you, if you desire a further witness, cast your mind upon the night that you cried unto me in your heart, that you might know concerning the truth of these things. ²³Did I not speak peace to your

mind concerning the matter? What greater witness can you have than from God? ²⁴And now, behold, you have received a witness; for if I have told you things which no man knoweth have you not received a witness?

²⁵And, behold, I grant unto you a gift, if you desire of me, to translate, even as my servant Joseph. ²⁶Verily, verily, I say unto you, that there are records which contain much of my gospel, which have been kept back because of the wickedness of the people; ²⁷And now I command you, that if you have good desires—a desire to lay up treasures for yourself in heaven—then shall you assist in bringing to light, with your gift, those parts of my scriptures which have been hidden because of iniquity. ²⁸And now, behold, I give unto you, and also unto my servant Joseph, the keys of this gift, which shall bring to light this ministry; and in the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established.

²⁹Verily, verily, I say unto you, if they reject my words, and this part of my gospel and ministry, blessed are ye, for they can do no more unto you than unto me. ³⁰And even if they do unto you even as they have done unto me, blessed are ye, for you shall dwell with me in glory. ³¹But if they reject not my words, which shall be established by the testimony which shall be given, blessed are they, and then shall ye have joy in the fruit of your labors.

¹Now, behold, I say unto you, that because you delivered up those writings which you had power given unto you to translate by the means of the Urim and Thummim, into the hands of a wicked man, you have lost them. ²And you also lost your gift at the same time, and your mind became darkened. ³Nevertheless, it is now restored unto you again; therefore see that you are faithful and continue on unto the finishing of the remainder of the work of translation as you have begun. ⁴Do not run faster or labor more than you have strength and means provided to enable you to translate; but be diligent unto the end.

⁵Pray always, that you may come off conqueror; yea, that you may conquer Satan, and that you may escape the hands of the servants of Satan that do uphold his work. ⁶Behold, they have sought to destroy you; yea, even the man in whom you have trusted has sought to destroy you. ⁷And for this cause I said that he is a wicked man, for he has sought to take away the things wherewith you have been entrusted; and he has also sought to destroy your gift. ⁸And because you have delivered the writings into his hands, behold, wicked men have taken them from you. ⁹Therefore, you have delivered them up, yea, that which was sacred, unto wickedness.

Satan's plan

¹⁰And, behold, Satan hath put it into their hearts to alter the words which you have caused to be written, or which you have translated, which

have gone out of your hands. ¹¹And behold, I say unto you, that because they have altered the words, they read contrary from that which you translated and caused to be written; ¹²And, on this wise, the devil has sought to lay a cunning plan, that he may destroy this work; ¹³For he hath put into their hearts to do this, that by lying they may say they have caught you in the words which you have pretended to translate.

¹⁴Verily, I say unto you, that I will not suffer that Satan shall accomplish his evil design in this thing. ¹⁵For behold, he has put it into their hearts to get thee to tempt the Lord thy God, in asking to translate it over again. ¹⁶And then, behold, they say and think in their hearts—We will see if God has given him power to translate; if so, he will also give him power again; ¹⁷And if God giveth him power again, or if he translates again, or, in other words, if he bringeth forth the same words, behold, we have the same with us, and we have altered them; ¹⁸Therefore they will not agree, and we will say that he has lied in his words, and that he has no gift, and that he has no power; ¹⁹Therefore we will destroy him, and also the work; and we will do this that we may not be ashamed in the end, and that we may get glory of the world.

²⁰Verily, verily, I say unto you, that Satan has great hold upon their hearts; he stirreth them up to iniquity against that which is good; ²¹And their hearts are corrupt, and full of wickedness and abominations; and they love darkness rather than light, because their deeds are evil; therefore they will not ask of me. ²²Satan stirreth them up, that he may lead their souls to destruction. ²³And thus he has laid a cunning plan, thinking to destroy the work of God; but I will require this at their hands, and it shall turn to their shame and condemnation in the day of judgment. ²⁴Yea, he stirreth up their hearts to anger against this work. ²⁵Yea, he saith unto them: Deceive and lie in wait to catch, that ye may destroy; behold, this is no harm. ³⁰Behold, I say unto you, that you shall not translate again those words which have gone forth out of your hands; ³¹For, behold, they shall not accomplish their evil designs in lying against those words. For, behold, if you should bring forth the same words they will say that you have lied and that you have pretended to translate, but that you have contradicted yourself. ³²And, behold, they will publish this, and Satan will harden the hearts of the people to stir them up to anger against you, that they will not believe my words. ³³Thus Satan thinketh to overpower your testimony in this generation, that the work may not come forth in this generation.

Release thyself from bondage. ³⁶Leave thy house and home, except when thou shalt desire to see thy family; ³⁷And speak freely to all; yea, preach, exhort, declare the truth, even with a loud voice, with a sound of rejoicing, crying—Hosanna, hosanna, blessed be the name of the Lord

God! ³⁸Pray always, and I will pour out my Spirit upon you, and great shall be your blessing—yea, even more than if you should obtain treasures of earth and corruptibleness to the extent thereof.

³⁹Behold, canst thou read this without rejoicing and lifting up thy heart for gladness? ⁴⁰Or canst thou run about longer as a blind guide? ⁴¹Or canst thou be humble and meek, and conduct thyself wisely before me? Yea, come unto me thy Savior. Amen.


ORGANIZING THE CHURCH

THE ARTICLES AND COVENANTS OF THE CHURCH 2 10 April 1830 See Fayette, New York

[†]The rise of the Church of Christ^a in these last days,^b being one thousand eight hundred and thirty years since the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the flesh, it being regularly organized and established agreeable to the laws of our country, by the will and commandments of God, in the fourth month, and on the sixth day of the month which is called April— ²Which commandments were given^c to Joseph Smith, Jun., who was called of God, and ordained an apostle of Jesus Christ, to be the first elder of this church; ³And to Oliver Cowdery, who was also called of God, an apostle of Jesus Christ,^d to be the second elder of this church, and ordained under his hand; ⁴And this according to the grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, to whom be all glory, both now and forever. Amen.

⁵After it was truly manifested unto this first elder that he had received a remission of his sins, he was entangled again in the vanities of the world;^a ⁶But after repenting, and humbling himself sincerely, through faith, God ministered unto him by an holy angel,^b whose countenance was as lightning, and whose garments were pure and white above all other whiteness; ⁷And gave unto him commandments which inspired him;^c ⁸And gave him power from on high, by the means which were before prepared, to translate the Book of Mormon;^d ⁹Which contains a record of a fallen people, and the fulness of the gospel of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles and to the Jews also; ¹⁰Which was given by inspiration, and is confirmed to others by the ministering of angels, and is declared unto the world by them^e— ¹¹Proving to the world that the holy scriptures are true,^f and that God does inspire men and call them to his holy work in this age and generation, as well as in generations of old; ¹²Thereby showing that he is the same God yesterday, today, and forever. crown of eternal life; ¹⁵But those who harden their hearts in unbelief, and reject it, it shall turn to their own condemnation— ¹⁶For the Lord God has spoken it; and we, the elders of the church, have heard and bear witness to the words of the glorious Majesty on high, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.

Creation, Fall, and Atonement

¹⁷By these things we know that there is a God in heaven, who is infinite and eternal, from everlasting to everlasting the same unchangeable God, the framer of heaven and earth, and all things which are in them; ¹⁸And that he created man, male and female, after his own image and in his own likeness, created he them; ¹⁹And gave unto them commandments that they should love and serve him, the only living and true God, and that he should be the only being whom they should worship. ²⁰But by the transgression of these holy laws man became sensual and devilish, and became fallen man.

Amen.

²⁹And we know that all men must repent and believe on the name of Jesus Christ, and worship the Father in his name, and endure in faith on his name to the end, or they cannot be saved in the kingdom of God. ³⁰And we know that justification through the grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is just and true; ³¹And we know also, that sanctification through the grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is just and true, to all those who love and serve God with all their mights, minds, and strength. ³²But there is a possibility that man may fall from grace and depart from the living

God; ³³Therefore let the church take heed and pray always, lest they fall into temptation; ³⁴Yea, and even let those who are sanctified take heed also.

³⁵And we know that these things are true and according to the revelations of John, neither adding to, nor diminishing from the prophecy of his book, ^a the holy scriptures, or the revelations of God which shall come hereafter by the gift and power of the Holy Ghost, the voice of God, or the ministering of angels. ³⁶And the Lord God has spoken it; and honor, power and glory be rendered to his holy name, both now and ever. Amen.

Manner of baptism

All those who humble themselves before God, and desire to be baptized, and come forth with broken hearts and contrite spirits, and witness before the church that they have truly repented of all their sins, and are willing to take upon them the name of Jesus Christ, having a determination to serve him to the end, and truly manifest by their works that they have received of the Spirit of Christ unto the remission of their sins, shall be received by baptism into his church.

An apostle is an elder, and it is his calling to baptize; ³⁹And to ordain other elders, priests, teachers, and deacons; ⁴⁰And to administer bread and wine—the emblems of the flesh and blood of Christ— ⁴¹And to confirm those who are baptized into the church, by the laying on of hands for the baptism of fire and the Holy Ghost, according to the scriptures; ⁴²And to teach, expound, exhort, baptize, and watch over the church; ⁴³And to

confirm the church by the laying on of the hands, and the giving of the Holy Ghost; ⁴⁴And to take the lead of all meetings.

⁴⁵The elders are to conduct the meetings as they are led by the Holy Ghost, according to the commandments and revelations of God.

⁴⁶The priest's duty is to preach, teach, expound, exhort, and baptize, and administer the sacrament, ⁴⁷And visit the house of each member, and exhort them to pray vocally and in secret and attend to all family duties. ⁴⁸And he may also ordain other priests, teachers, and deacons. ⁴⁹And he is to take the lead of meetings when there is no elder present; ⁵⁰But when there is an elder present, he is only to preach, teach, expound, exhort, and baptize, ⁵¹And visit the house of each member, exhorting them to pray vocally and in secret and attend to all family duties. ⁵²In all these duties the priest is to assist the elder if occasion requires.

⁵⁹The teacher's duty is to watch over the church always, and be with and strengthen them; ⁵⁴And see that there is no iniquity in the church, neither hardness with each other, neither lying, backbiting, nor evil speaking; ⁵⁵And see that the church meet together often, and also see that all the members do their duty. ⁵⁶And he is to take the lead of meetings in the absence of the elder or priest— ⁵⁷And is to be assisted always, in all his duties in the church, by the deacons, if occasion requires. ⁵⁸But neither teachers nor deacons have authority to baptize, administer the sacrament, or lay on hands; ⁵⁹They are, however, to warn, expound, exhort, and teach, and invite all to come unto Christ.

Church business

⁶⁰Every elder, priest, teacher, or deacon is to be ordained according to the gifts and callings of God unto him; and he is to be ordained by the power of the Holy Ghost, which is in the one who ordains him. ^b ^{6†}The several elders composing this church of Christ are to meet in conference once in three months, or from time to time as said conferences shall direct or appoint; ⁶²And said conferences are to do whatever church business is necessary to be done at the time.

⁶³The elders are to receive their licenses from other elders, by vote of the church to which they belong, or from the conferences. ⁶⁴Each priest, teacher, or deacon, who is ordained by a priest, ^c may take a certificate from

⁶⁵No person is to be ordained to any office in this church, where there is a regularly organized branch of the same, without the vote of that church; ⁶⁶But the presiding elders, traveling bishops, high councilors, high priests, and elders, may have the privilege of ordaining, where there is no branch of the church that a vote may be called. ⁶⁷Every president of the high priesthood (or presiding elder), bishop, high councilor, and high priest, is to be ordained by the direction of a high council or general conference.^a

Duty of the members

⁶⁸The duty of the members after they are received by baptism.—

Ordinances

The elders or priests are to have a sufficient time to expound all things concerning the church of Christ to their understanding, previous to their partaking of the sacrament and being confirmed by the laying on of the hands of the elders, so that all things may be done in order. ⁶⁹And the members shall manifest before the church, and also before the elders, by a godly walk and conversation, that they are worthy of it, that there may be works and faith agreeable to the holy scriptures—walking in holiness before the Lord.

⁷⁰Every member of the church of Christ having children is to bring them unto the elders before the church, who are to lay their hands upon them in the name of Jesus Christ, and bless them in his name. ⁷¹No one can be received into the church of Christ unless he has arrived unto the years of accountability before God, ^b and is capable of repentance.

⁷²Baptism is to be administered in the following manner unto all those who repent— ⁷³The person who is called of God and has authority from Jesus Christ to baptize, shall go down into the water with the person who has presented himself or herself for baptism, and shall say, calling him or her by name: Having been commissioned of Jesus Christ, I baptize you

Amen. ^d

Behold, there shall be a record kept among you; and in it thou shalt be called a seer, a translator, a prophet, an apostle of Jesus Christ, an elder of the church through the will of God the Father, and the grace of your Lord Jesus Christ, Being inspired of the Holy Ghost to lay the foundation thereof, and to build it up unto the most holy faith. Which church was organized and established in the year of your Lord eighteen hundred and thirty, in the fourth month, and on the sixth day of the month which is called April.

⁴Wherefore, meaning the church, thou shalt give heed unto all his words and commandments which he shall give unto you as he receiveth them, walking in all holiness before me; ⁵For his word ye shall receive, as if from mine own mouth, in all patience and faith. ⁶For by doing these things the gates of hell shall not prevail against you; yea, and the Lord God will disperse the powers of darkness from before you, and cause the heavens to shake for your good, and his name's glory.

Behold, I say unto you that all old covenants have I caused to be done away in this thing; and this is a new and an everlasting covenant, even that which was from the beginning. Wherefore, although a man should be baptized an hundred times it availeth him nothing, for you cannot enter in at the strait gate by the law of Moses, neither by your dead works. For it is because of your dead works that I have caused this last covenant and this church to be built up unto me, even as in days of old. Wherefore, enter ye in at the gate, as I have commanded, and seek not to counsel your God. Amen.





Sections 41–112 February 1831–January 1838

The Lord commanded his saints to relocate to Ohio, promising to eventually reveal a more significant gathering place that would be the center place of Zion. This was soon revealed to be Missouri, and for several years, both places served as the two main centers of the Church. The saints practiced consecration, published revelations, and built their first temple. The Missouri saints had to move to different parts of that state to escape violent persecution. The Ohio saints eventually faced a period of apostasy, leading the faithful to abandon that state and join the rest of the Church in Missouri.



³⁰And behold, thou wilt remember the poor, and consecrate of thy properties for their support that which thou hast to impart unto them, with a covenant and a deed^b which cannot be broken. ³¹And inasmuch as ye impart of your substance unto the poor, ye will do it unto me; and they shall be laid before the bishop of my church^c and his counselors, two of the elders, or high priests, such as he shall appoint or has appointed and set apart for that purpose. ³²And it shall come to pass, that after they are laid before the bishop of my church, and after that he has received these testimonies concerning the consecration of the properties of my church, that they cannot be taken from the church,^d agreeable to my commandments, every man shall be made accountable unto me, a steward over his own property, or that which he has received by consecration, as much as is sufficient for himself and family.

every man who has need may be amply supplied and receive according to his wants.^a ³⁴Therefore, the residue shall be kept in my storehouse, to administer to the poor and the needy, as shall be appointed by the high council of the church,^b and the bishop and his council; ³⁵And for the purpose of purchasing lands for the public benefit of the church, and building houses of worship, and building up of the New Jerusalem which is hereafter to be revealed^c— ³⁶That my covenant people may be gathered in one in that day when I shall come to my temple.^d And this I do for the salvation of my people.

³⁷And it shall come to pass, that he that sinneth and repenteth not shall be cast out of the church, and shall not receive again that which he has consecrated unto the poor and the needy of my church, or in other words, unto me— ³⁸For inasmuch as ye do it unto the least of these, ye do it unto me. ³⁹For it shall come to pass, that which I spake by the mouths of my prophets shall be fulfilled; for I will consecrate of the riches of those who embrace my gospel among the Gentiles unto the poor of my people who are of the house of Israel.

⁴⁰And again, thou shalt not be proud in thy heart; let all thy garments be plain, and their beauty the beauty of the work of thine own hands; ⁴¹And let all things be done in cleanliness before me. ⁴²Thou shalt not be idle; for he that is idle shall not eat the bread nor wear the garments of the laborer.

⁴³And whosoever among you are sick, and have not faith to be healed, but believe, shall be nourished with all tenderness, with herbs and mild food, and that not by the hand of an enemy. ⁴⁴And the elders of the church, two or more, shall be called, and shall pray for and lay their hands upon them in my name;⁸ and if they die they shall die unto me, and if they live they shall live unto me.

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me shall not taste of death, for it shall be sweet unto them; ⁴⁷And they that die not in me, wo unto them, for their death is bitter.

⁴⁸And again, it shall come to pass that he that hath faith in me to be healed, and is not appointed unto death, shall be healed. ⁴⁹He who hath faith to see shall see. ⁵⁰He who hath faith to hear shall hear. ⁵¹The lame who hath faith to leap shall leap. ⁵²And they who have not faith to do these things, but believe in me, have power to become my sons; and inasmuch as they break not my laws thou shalt bear their infirmities.

words, if they shall testify before you in all lowliness of heart that this is the case, ye shall not cast them out from among you; ⁷⁵But if ye shall find that any persons have left their companions for the sake of adultery, and they themselves are the offenders, and their companions are living, they shall be cast out from among you. ⁷⁶And again, I say unto you, that ye shall be watchful and careful, with all inquiry, that ye receive none such among you if they are married; ⁷⁷And if they are not married, they shall repent of all their sins or ye shall not receive them.

The law of the land and the law of God

⁷⁸And again, every person who belongeth to this church of Christ, shall observe to keep all the commandments and covenants of the church.

⁷⁹And it shall come to pass, that if any persons among you shall kill they shall be delivered up and dealt with according to the laws of the land; for remember that he hath no forgiveness; and it shall be proved according to the laws of the land.

And if he or she confess not, he or she shall be delivered up unto the law of God.^a ⁹²If any shall offend in secret, he or she shall be rebuked in secret, that he or she may have opportunity to confess in secret to him or her whom he or she has offended, and to God, that the church may not speak reproachfully of him or her.

THE LAW OF REVELATIONS AND COMMANDMENTS February 1831 Kirtland, Ohio

O hearken, ye elders of my church, and give ear to the words which I shall speak unto you. ²For behold, verily, verily, I say unto you, that ye have received a commandment for a law unto my church, through him whom I have appointed^d unto you to receive commandments and revelations from my hand. ³And this ye shall know assuredly—that there is none other appointed unto you to receive commandments and revelations until he be taken, if he abide in me. ⁴But verily, verily, I say unto you, that none else shall be appointed unto this gift except it be through him; for if it be taken from him^e he shall not have power except to appoint another in his stead. ⁵And this shall be a law unto you, that ye receive not the teachings of any that shall come before you as revelations or commandments; ⁶And this I give unto you that you may not be deceived, that you may know they are not of me. ⁷For verily I say unto you, that he that is ordained of me shall come in at the gate and be ordained as I have told you before, to teach those revelations which you have received and shall receive through him whom I have appointed.

⁸And now, behold, I give unto you a commandment, that when ye are assembled together ye shall instruct and edify each other, that ye may know how to act and direct my church, how to act upon the points of my

law and commandments, which I have given. ^a ⁹And thus ye shall become instructed in the law of my church, and be sanctified by that which ye have received, and ye shall bind yourselves to act in all holiness before me— ¹⁰That inasmuch as ye do this, glory shall be added to the kingdom which ye have received. Inasmuch as ye do it not, it shall be taken, even that which ye have received.

¹⁷Purge ye out the iniquity which is among you; sanctify yourselves before me; ¹²And if ye desire the glories of the kingdom, appoint ye my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., and uphold him before me by the prayer of faith. ¹³And again, I say unto you, that if ye desire the mysteries of the kingdom, provide for him food and raiment, and whatsoever thing he needeth to accomplish the work wherewith I have commanded him; ^b ¹⁴And if ye do it not he shall remain unto them that have received him, that I may reserve unto myself a pure people before me.

Teaching before the great day of the Lord

¹⁵Again I say, hearken ye elders of my church, whom I have appointed: Ye are not sent forth to be taught, but to teach the children of men the things which I have put into your hands by the power of my Spirit; ¹⁶And ye are to be taught from on high. Sanctify yourselves and ye shall be endowed with power,^c that ye may give even as I have spoken. ¹⁷Hearken ye, for, behold, the great day of the Lord is nigh at hand.

¹⁸For the day cometh that the Lord shall utter his voice out of heaven; the heavens shall shake and the earth shall tremble, and the trump of God shall sound both long and loud, and shall say to the sleeping nations: Ye saints arise and live; ye sinners stay and sleep until I shall call again.

¹⁹Wherefore gird up your loins lest ye be found among the wicked. ²⁰Lift up your voices and spare not. Call upon the nations to repent, both old and young, both bond and free, saying: Prepare yourselves for the great day of the Lord; ²¹For if I, who am a man, do lift up my voice and call upon you to repent, and ye hate me, what will ye say when the day cometh when the thunders shall utter their voices from the ends of the earth, speaking to the ears of all that live, saying—Repent, and prepare for the great day of the Lord? ²²Yea, and again, when the lightnings shall streak forth from the east unto the west, and shall utter forth their voices unto all that live, and make

the ears of all tingle that hear, saying these words—Repent ye, for the great day of the Lord is come?

²³And again, the Lord shall utter his voice out of heaven, saying: Hearken, O ye nations of the earth, and hear the words of that God who made you. ²⁴O, ye nations of the earth, how often would I have gathered you together as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, but ye would not! ²⁵How oft have I called upon you by the mouth of my servants, and by the ministering of angels, and by mine own voice, and by the voice of thunderings, and by the voice of lightnings, and by the voice of tempests, and by the voice of earthquakes, and great hailstorms, and by the voice of famines and pestilences of every kind, and by the great sound of a trump, and by the voice of judgment, and by the voice of mercy all the day long, and by the voice of glory and honor and the riches of eternal life, and would have saved you with an everlasting salvation, but ye would not! ²⁶Behold, the day has come, when the cup of the wrath of mine indignation is full.

²⁷Behold, verily I say unto you, that these are the words of the Lord your God. ²⁸Wherefore, labor ye, labor ye in my vineyard for the last time—for the last time call upon the inhabitants of the earth. ²⁹For in mine own due time will I come upon the earth in judgment, and my people shall be redeemed and shall reign with me on earth. ³⁰For the great Millennium, of which I have spoken by the mouth of my servants, ^a shall come. ³¹For Satan shall be bound, and when he is loosed again he shall only reign for a little season, and then cometh the end of the earth. ³²And he that liveth in righteousness shall be changed in the twinkling of an eye, and the earth shall pass away so as by fire. ³³And the wicked shall go away into unquenchable fire, and their end no man knoweth on earth, nor ever shall know, until they come before me in judgment.

³⁴Hearken ye to these words. Behold, I am Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world. Treasure these things up in your hearts, and let the solemnities of eternity rest upon your minds. ³⁵Be sober. Keep all my commandments. Even so. Amen.

¹Hearken, O ye people of my church, to whom the kingdom has been given; hearken ye and give ear to him who laid the foundation of the earth, who made the heavens and all the hosts thereof, and by whom all things were made which live, and move, and have a being. ²And again I say, hearken unto my voice, lest death shall overtake you; in an hour when ye think not the summer shall be past, and the harvest ended, and your souls not saved. ³Listen to him who is the advocate with the Father, who is pleading your cause before him— ⁴Saying: Father, behold the sufferings and death of him who did no sin, in whom thou wast well pleased; behold the blood of thy Son which was shed, the blood of him whom thou gavest that thyself might be glorified; ⁵Wherefore, Father, spare these my brethren that believe

⁷For verily I say unto you that I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the light and the life of the world—a light that shineth in darkness and the darkness comprehendeth it not. ⁸I came unto mine own, and mine own received me not; but unto as many as received me gave I power to do many miracles, and to become the sons of God; and even unto them that believed on my name gave I power to obtain eternal life.

⁹And even so I have sent mine everlasting covenant into the world, to be a light to the world, and to be a standard for my people, and for the Gentiles to seek to it, and to be a messenger before my face to prepare the way before me. ¹⁰Wherefore, come ye unto it, and with him that cometh I will reason as with men in days of old, and I will show unto you my strong reasoning.

Prophecies of the day of the Lord

be a bondage, I will show unto you how the day of redemption shall come, and also the restoration of the scattered Israel.

¹⁸And now ye behold this temple which is in Jerusalem, which ye call the house of God, and your enemies say that this house shall never fall. ¹⁹But, verily I say unto you, that desolation shall come upon this generation as a thief in the night, and this people shall be destroyed and scattered among all nations. ²⁰And this temple which ye now see shall be thrown down that there shall not be left one stone upon another. ²¹And it shall come to pass, that this generation of Jews shall not pass away until every desolation which I have told you concerning them shall come to pass. ²²Ye say that ye know that the end of the world cometh; ye say also that ye know that the heavens and the earth shall pass away; ²³And in this ye say truly, for so it is; but these things which I have told you shall not pass away until all shall be fulfilled. ²⁴And this I have told you concerning Jerusalem; and when that day shall come, shall a remnant be scattered among all nations;

¹Hearken, O ye people of my church; for verily I say unto you that these things were spoken unto you for your profit and learning. ²But notwithstanding those things which are written, ^a it always has been given to the elders of my church from the beginning, and ever shall be, to conduct all meetings as they are directed and guided by the Holy Spirit.

³Nevertheless ye are commanded never to cast any one out from your public meetings, which are held before the world. ⁴Ye are also commanded not to cast any one who belongeth to the church out of your sacrament meetings; nevertheless, if any have trespassed, let him not partake until he makes reconciliation. ⁵And again I say unto you, ye shall not cast any out of your sacrament meetings who are earnestly seeking the kingdom—I speak this concerning those who are not of the church. ⁶And again I say unto you, concerning your confirmation meetings, that if there be any that are not of the church, that are earnestly seeking after the kingdom, ye shall not cast them out.

⁷But ye are commanded in all things to ask of God, who giveth liberally; and that which the Spirit testifies unto you even so I would that ye should do in all holiness of heart, walking uprightly before me, considering the end of your salvation, doing all things with prayer and thanksgiving, that ye may not be seduced by evil spirits, or doctrines of devils, or the commandments of men; for some are of men, and others of devils.

⁷And let that which belongs to this people be appointed unto this people. ⁸And the money which is left unto this people—let there be an agent appointed unto this people, to take the money to provide food and raiment, according to the wants of this people. ⁹And let every man deal



Amen.

- ⁷Thou shalt thank the Lord thy God in all things.
- Thou shalt offer a sacrifice unto the Lord thy God in righteousness, even that of a broken heart and a contrite spirit.

⁹And that thou mayest more fully keep thyself unspotted from the world, thou shalt go to the house of prayer and offer up thy sacraments upon my holy day; ¹⁰For verily this is a day appointed unto you to rest from your labors, and to pay thy devotions unto the Most High; ¹¹Nevertheless thy vows shall be offered up in righteousness on all days and at all times; ¹²But remember that on this, the Lord's day, thou shalt offer thine oblations and thy sacraments unto the Most High, confessing thy sins unto thy brethren, and before the Lord. ¹³And on this day thou shalt do none other thing, only let thy food be prepared with singleness of heart that thy fasting may be perfect, or, in other words, that thy joy may be full. ¹⁴Verily, this is fasting and prayer, or in other words, rejoicing and prayer.

⁵But, verily, I will speak unto you concerning your journey unto the land from whence you came. Let there be a craft made, or bought, as seemeth you good, it mattereth not unto me, and take your journey speedily for the place which is called St. Louis. ⁶And from thence let my servants, Sidney Rigdon, Joseph Smith, Jun., and Oliver Cowdery, take their journey for Cincinnati; ⁷And in this place let them lift up their voice and declare my word with loud voices, without wrath or doubting, lifting up holy hands upon them. For I am able to make you holy, and your sins are forgiven you.

⁸And let the residue take their journey from St. Louis, two by two, and preach the word, not in haste, among the congregations of the wicked, until they return to the churches from whence they came. ^c ⁹And all this for the good of the churches; for this intent have I sent them.

Phelps take their former company, and let them take their journey in haste that they may fill their mission, and through faith they shall overcome; ¹⁰And inasmuch as they are faithful they shall be preserved, and I, the Lord, will be with them. ¹¹And let the residue take that which is needful for clothing. ¹²Let my servant Sidney Gilbert take that which is not needful with him, as you shall agree.

²³And now, concerning my servants, Sidney Rigdon, Joseph Smith, Jun., and Oliver Cowdery, let them come not again upon the waters, save it be upon the canal, while journeying unto their homes; or in other words they shall not come upon the waters to journey, save upon the canal. ²⁴Behold, I, the Lord, have appointed a way for the journeying of my saints; and behold, this is the way—that after they leave the canal they shall journey by land, inasmuch as they are commanded to journey and go up unto the land of Zion; ²⁵And they shall do like unto the children of Israel, pitching their tents by the way.^a

³⁶And now, verily I say unto you, and what I say unto one I say unto all, be of good cheer, little children; for I am in your midst, and I have not forsaken you; ³⁷And inasmuch as you have humbled yourselves before me,



¹Hearken, O ye people, and open your hearts and give ear from afar; and listen, you that call yourselves the people of the Lord, and hear the word of the Lord and his will concerning you. ²Yea, verily, I say, hear the word of him whose anger is kindled against the wicked and rebellious; ³Who willeth to take even them whom he will take, and preserveth in life them whom he will preserve; ⁴Who buildeth up at his own will and pleasure; and destroyeth when he pleases, and is able to cast the soul down to hell. ⁵Behold, I, the Lord, utter my voice, and it shall be obeyed. ⁶Wherefore, verily I say, let the wicked take heed, and let the rebellious fear and tremble; and let the unbelieving hold their lips, for the day of wrath shall come upon them as a whirlwind, and all flesh shall know that I am God.

⁷And he that seeketh signs shall see signs, but not unto salvation. ⁸Verily, I say unto you, there are those among you who seek signs, and there have been such even from the beginning; ⁹But, behold, faith cometh not by signs, but signs follow those that believe. ¹⁰Yea, signs come by faith, not by the will of men, nor as they please, but by the will of God. ¹⁷Yea, signs come by faith, unto mighty works, for without faith no man pleaseth God;

¹⁹And now behold, I, the Lord, say unto you that ye are not justified, because these things are among you. ²⁰Nevertheless, he that endureth in faith and doeth my will, the same shall overcome, and shall receive an inheritance upon the earth when the day of transfiguration shall come; ²¹When the earth shall be transfigured, even according to the pattern which was shown unto mine apostles upon the mount; ^b of which account the fulness ye have not yet received.

²²And now, verily I say unto you, that as I said that I would make known my will unto you, ^c behold I will make it known unto you, not by the way of commandment, for there are many who observe not to keep my commandments. ²³But unto him that keepeth my commandments I will give the mysteries of my kingdom, and the same shall be in him a well of living water, springing up unto everlasting life. ^d

²⁴And now, behold, this is the will of the Lord your God concerning his saints, that they should assemble themselves together unto the land of Zion, not in haste, lest there should be confusion, which bringeth pestilence. ²⁵Behold, the land of Zion—I, the Lord, hold it in mine own hands; ²⁶Nevertheless, I, the Lord, render unto Cæsar the things which are Cæsar's. ^e ²⁷Wherefore, I the Lord will that you should purchase the lands, that you may have advantage of the world, that you may have claim on the world, that they may not be stirred up unto anger. ²⁸For Satan putteth it into their hearts to anger against you, and to the shedding of blood. ²⁹Wherefore, the land of Zion shall not be obtained but by purchase or by blood, otherwise there is none inheritance for you. ³⁰And if by purchase, behold you are blessed; ³¹And if by blood, as you are forbidden to shed blood, ^f lo, your enemies are upon you, and ye shall be scourged from city to city, and from synagogue to synagogue, and but few shall stand to receive an inheritance.

³²I, the Lord, am angry with the wicked; I am holding my Spirit from the inhabitants of the earth. ³³I have sworn in my wrath, and decreed wars upon the face of the earth, and the wicked shall slay the wicked, and fear shall come upon every man; ³⁴And the saints also shall hardly escape; nevertheless, I, the Lord, am with them, and will come down in heaven from the presence of my Father and consume the wicked with unquenchable fire. ³⁵And behold, this is not yet, but by and by.

³⁶Wherefore, seeing that I, the Lord, have decreed all these things upon the face of the earth, I will that my saints should be assembled upon the land of Zion; ³⁷And that every man should take righteousness in his hands and faithfulness upon his loins, and lift a warning voice unto the inhabitants of the earth; and declare both by word and by flight that desolation shall come upon the wicked.

Whitney retain his store, or in other words, the store, yet for a little season. ⁴³Nevertheless, let him impart all the money which he can impart, to be sent up unto the land of Zion. ⁴⁴Behold, these things are in his own hands, let him do according to wisdom. ⁴⁵Verily I say, let him be ordained as an agent unto the disciples that shall tarry, ^b and let him be ordained unto this power; ⁴⁶And now speedily visit the churches, expounding these things unto them, with my servant Oliver Cowdery. Behold, this is my will, obtaining moneys even as I have directed.

¹⁶And if they be literal descendants of Aaron they have a legal right to the bishopric, if they are the firstborn among the sons of Aaron; ¹⁷For the firstborn holds the right of the presidency over this priesthood, and the keys or authority of the same. ¹⁸No man has a legal right to this office, to hold the keys of this priesthood, except he be a literal descendant and the firstborn of Aaron. 19But, as a high priest of the Melchizedek Priesthood has authority to officiate in all the lesser offices he may officiate in the office of bishop when no literal descendant of Aaron can be found, provided he is called and set apart and ordained unto this power, under the hands of the First Presidency of the Melchizedek Priesthood. 20 And a literal descendant of Aaron, also, must be designated by this Presidency, and found worthy, and anointed, and ordained under the hands of this Presidency, otherwise they are not legally authorized to officiate in their priesthood. ²¹But, by virtue of the decree concerning their right of the priesthood descending from father to son, they may claim their anointing if at any time they can prove their lineage, or do ascertain it by revelation from the Lord under the hands of the above named Presidency.^b

⁹Behold, this is what the Lord requires of every man in his stewardship, even as I, the Lord, have appointed or shall hereafter appoint unto any man. ¹⁰And behold, none are exempt from this law who belong to the church of the living God; ¹¹Yea, neither the bishop, ^b neither the agent who keepeth the Lord's storehouse, ^c neither he who is appointed in a stewardship over temporal things.

¹⁶And now, verily I say unto you, that as every elder in this part of the vineyard must give an account of his stewardship unto the bishop in this part of the vineyard— ¹⁷A certificate^a from the judge or bishop in this part of the vineyard, unto the bishop in Zion, rendereth every man acceptable, and answereth all things, for an inheritance, and to be received as a wise steward and as a faithful laborer; ¹⁸Otherwise he shall not be accepted of the bishop of Zion.

came to pass that there arose a great contention among the people concerning the law of circumcision, for the unbelieving husband was desirous that his children should be circumcised and become subject to the law of Moses, a which law was fulfilled. And it came to pass that the children, being brought up in subjection to the law of Moses, gave heed to the traditions of their fathers and believed not the gospel of Christ, wherein they became unholy.

TRANSLATING THE BOOK OF REVELATION

March 1832 **←** *Hiram*, *Ohio*

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¹Q. What is the sea of glass spoken of by John, 4th chapter, and 6th verse of the Revelation?^a

A. It is the earth, in its sanctified, immortal, and eternal state.

 2 Q. What are we to understand by the four beasts, spoken of in the same verse? b

A. They are figurative expressions, used by the Revelator, John, in describing heaven, the paradise of God, the happiness of man, and of beasts, and of creeping things, and of the fowls of the air; that which is spiritual being in the likeness of that which is temporal; and that which is temporal in the likeness of that which is spiritual; the spirit of man in the likeness of his person, as also the spirit of the beast, and every other creature which God has created.

³Q. Are the four beasts limited to individual beasts, or do they represent classes or orders?

A. They are limited to four individual beasts, which were shown to John, to represent the glory of the classes of beings in their destined order or sphere of creation, in the enjoyment of their eternal felicity.

At Rev. 4:1–2, 6–8, John says, "¹A door was opened in heaven ... ²and, behold, a throne was set in heaven, and one sat on the throne. ... ⁸And before the throne there was a *sea of glass* like unto crystal: ... and round about the throne, were *four beasts* full of *eyes* before and behind. ⁷And the first beast was like a lion, and the second beast like a calf, and the third beast had a face as a man, and the fourth beast was like a flying eagle. ⁸And *the four beasts* had each of them six *wings* about him; and they were full of *eyes* within: and they rest not day and night, saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come."

⁴Q. What are we to understand by the eyes and wings, which the beasts had?^a

A. Their eyes are a representation of light and knowledge, that is, they are full of knowledge; and their wings are a representation of power, to move, to act, etc.

⁵Q. What are we to understand by the four and twenty elders, spoken of by John?^b

A. We are to understand that these elders whom John saw, were elders who had been faithful in the work of the ministry and were dead; who belonged to the seven churches, and were then in the paradise of God.

⁶Q. What are we to understand by the book which John saw, which was sealed on the back with seven seals? ^d

A. We are to understand that it contains the revealed will, mysteries, and the works of God; the hidden things of his economy concerning this earth during the seven thousand years of its continuance, or its temporal existence.

⁷Q. What are we to understand by the seven seals with which it was sealed?^e

A. We are to understand that the first seal contains the things of the first thousand years, and the second also of the second thousand years, and so on until the seventh.

⁸Q. What are we to understand by the four angels, spoken of in the 7th chapter and 1st verse of Revelation?^a

A. We are to understand that they are four angels sent forth from God, to whom is given power over the four parts of the earth, to save life and to destroy; these are they who have the everlasting gospel to commit to every nation, kindred, tongue, and people; having power to shut up the heavens, to seal up unto life, or to cast down to the regions of darkness.

⁹Q. What are we to understand by the angel ascending from the east, Revelation 7th chapter and 2nd verse?^b

A. We are to understand that the angel ascending from the east is he to whom is given the seal of the living God over the twelve tribes of Israel; wherefore, he crieth unto the four angels having the everlasting gospel, saying: Hurt not the earth, neither the sea, nor the trees, till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads. And, if you will receive it, this is Elias which was to come to gather together the tribes of Israel and restore all things.

¹⁰Q. What time are the things spoken of in this chapter to be accomplished?

A. They are to be accomplished in the sixth thousand years, or the opening of the sixth seal. d

¹¹Q. What are we to understand by sealing the one hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel—twelve thousand out of every tribe?^e

A. We are to understand that those who are sealed are high priests, ordained unto the holy order of God, to administer the everlasting gospel; for they are they who are ordained out of every nation, kindred, tongue,

and people,^a by the angels to whom is given power over the nations of the earth, to bring as many as will come to the church of the Firstborn.^b

¹²Q. What are we to understand by the sounding of the trumpets, mentioned in the 8th chapter of Revelation?^c

A. We are to understand that as God made the world in six days, and on the seventh day he finished his work, and sanctified it, and also formed man out of the dust of the earth, deven so, in the beginning of the seventh thousand years will the Lord God sanctify the earth, and complete the salvation of man, and judge all things, and shall redeem all things, except that which he hath not put into his power, when he shall have sealed all things, unto the end of all things; and the sounding of the trumpets of the seven angels are the preparing and finishing of his work, in the beginning of the seventh thousand years—the preparing of the way before the time of his coming.

¹³Q. When are the things to be accomplished, which are written in the 9th chapter of Revelation?^e

A. They are to be accomplished after the opening of the seventh seal, before the coming of Christ.

¹⁵Q. What is to be understood by the two witnesses, in the eleventh chapter of Revelation?^c

A. They are two prophets that are to be raised up to the Jewish nation in the last days, at the time of the restoration, and to prophesy to the Jews after they are gathered and have built the city of Jerusalem in the land of their fathers.



who was slain by the conspiracy of his brother, who received the priesthood by the commandments of God,

by the hand of his father Adam, who was the first man—

¹⁷Which priesthood continueth in the church of God in all generations, and is without beginning of days or end of years. ¹⁸And the Lord confirmed a priesthood also upon Aaron and his seed, ^a throughout all their generations, which priesthood also continueth and abideth forever with the priesthood which is after the holiest order of God.

¹⁹And this greater priesthood administereth the gospel and holdeth the key of the mysteries of the kingdom, even the key of the knowledge of God. ²⁰Therefore, in the ordinances thereof, the power of godliness is manifest. ²¹And without the ordinances thereof, and the authority of the priesthood, the power of godliness is not manifest unto men in the flesh; ²²For without this no man can see the face of God, even the Father, and live.

Therefore, as I said^b concerning the sons of Moses—for the sons of Moses and also the sons of Aaron shall offer an acceptable offering and sacrifice in the house of the Lord, which house shall be built unto the Lord in this generation, upon the consecrated spot as I have appointed—³²And the sons of Moses and of Aaron shall be filled with the glory of the Lord, upon Mount Zion in the Lord's house, whose sons are ye; and also many whom I have called and sent forth to build up my church. ³³For whoso is faithful unto the obtaining these two priesthoods of which I have spoken, and the magnifying their calling, are sanctified by the Spirit unto the renewing of their bodies. ³⁴They become the sons of Moses and of Aaron and the seed of Abraham, and the church and kingdom, and the elect of God.

³⁵And also all they who receive this priesthood receive me, saith the Lord; ³⁶For he that receiveth my servants receiveth me; ³⁷And he that receiveth me receiveth my Father; ³⁸And he that receiveth my Father receiveth my Father's kingdom; therefore all that my Father hath shall be given unto him. ³⁹And this is according to the oath and covenant which belongeth to the priesthood.

⁴⁰Therefore, all those who receive the priesthood, receive this oath and covenant of my Father, which he cannot break, neither can it be moved. ⁴¹But whoso breaketh this covenant after he hath received it, and altogether turneth therefrom, shall not have forgiveness of sins in this world nor in the world to come. ⁴²And wo unto all those who come not unto this priesthood which ye have received, which I now confirm upon you who are present this day, by mine own voice out of the heavens; and even I have given the heavenly hosts and mine angels charge concerning you.

⁶³And as I said unto mine^a apostles, even so I say unto you, for you are mine apostles, even God's high priests; ye are they whom my Father hath given me; ye are my friends; ⁶⁴Therefore, as I said unto mine apostles I say unto you again, that every soul who believeth on your words, and is baptized by water for the remission of sins, shall receive the Holy Ghost. ⁶⁵And these signs shall follow them that believe— ⁶⁶In my name they shall do many wonderful works; ⁶⁷In my name they shall cast out devils; ⁶⁸In my name they shall heal the sick; ⁶⁹In my name they shall open the eyes of the blind, and unstop the ears of the deaf; ⁷⁰And the tongue of the dumb shall speak; ⁷¹And if any man shall administer poison unto them it shall not hurt them; ⁷²And the poison of a serpent shall not have power to harm them.

⁹²He that receiveth you not, go away from him alone by yourselves, and cleanse your feet even with water, pure water, whether in heat or in cold, and bear testimony of it unto your Father which is in heaven, and return not again unto that man. ⁹³And in whatsoever village or city ye enter, do likewise.

Verily, thus saith the Lord concerning the wars that will shortly come to pass, beginning at the rebellion of South Carolina, which will eventually terminate in the death and misery of many souls; ²And the time will come that war will be poured out upon all nations, beginning at this place. ³For behold, the Southern States shall be divided against the Northern States, and the Southern States will call on other nations, even the nation of Great Britain, as it is called, and they shall also call upon other nations, in order to defend themselves against other nations; and then war shall be poured out upon all nations. ⁴And it shall come to pass, after many days, slaves shall rise up against their masters, who shall be marshaled and disciplined for war. ⁵And it shall come to pass also that the remnants^c who are left of the land will marshal themselves, and shall become exceedingly angry, and shall vex the Gentiles with a sore vexation.

¹⁴Now, verily I say unto you, that through the redemption which is made for you is brought to pass the resurrection from the dead. ¹⁵And the spirit and the body are the soul of man. ¹⁶And the resurrection from the dead is the redemption of the soul. ¹⁷And the redemption of the soul is through him that quickeneth all things, in whose bosom it is decreed that the poor and the meek of the earth shall inherit it. ¹⁸Therefore, it must needs be sanctified from all unrighteousness, that it may be prepared for the celestial glory; ¹⁹For after it hath filled the measure of its creation, it shall be crowned with glory, even with the presence of God the Father; ²⁰That bodies who are of the celestial kingdom may possess it forever and ever; for, for this intent was it made and created, and for this intent are they sanctified.

²¹And they who are not sanctified through the law which I have given unto you, even the law of Christ, must inherit another kingdom, even that of a terrestrial kingdom, or that of a telestial kingdom.

²²For he who is not able to abide the law of a celestial kingdom cannot abide a celestial glory.

²³And he who cannot abide the law of a terrestrial kingdom cannot abide a terrestrial glory.

²⁴And he who cannot abide the law of a telestial kingdom cannot abide a telestial glory;

therefore he is not meet for a kingdom of glory. Therefore he must abide a kingdom which is not a kingdom of glory.

²⁵And again, verily I say unto you, the earth abideth the law of a celestial kingdom, for it filleth the measure of its creation, and transgresseth not the law— ²⁶Wherefore, it shall be sanctified; yea, notwithstanding it shall die, it shall be quickened again, and shall abide the power by which it is quickened, and the righteous shall inherit it.

²⁷For notwithstanding they die, they also shall rise again, a spiritual body. ²⁸They who are of a celestial spirit shall receive the same body which was a natural body; even ye shall receive your bodies, and your glory shall be that glory by which your bodies are quickened.

²⁹Ye who are quickened by a portion of the celestial glory shall then receive of the same, even a fulness.

³⁰And they who are quickened by a portion of the terrestrial glory shall then receive of the same, even a fulness.

³¹And also they who are quickened by a portion of the telestial glory shall then receive of the same, even a fulness.

³²And they who remain shall also be quickened; nevertheless, they shall return again to their own place, to enjoy that which they are willing to receive, because they were not willing to enjoy that which they might have received. ³³For what doth it profit a man if a gift is bestowed upon him, and he receive not the gift? Behold, he rejoices not in that which is given unto him, neither rejoices in him who is the giver of the gift.

³⁴And again, verily I say unto you, that which is governed by law is also preserved by law and perfected and sanctified by the same. ³⁵That which breaketh a law, and abideth not by law, but seeketh to become a law unto itself, and willeth to abide in sin, and altogether abideth in sin, cannot be sanctified by law, neither by mercy, justice, nor judgment. Therefore, they must remain filthy still.

³⁶All kingdoms have a law given; ³⁷And there are many kingdoms; for there is no space in the which there is no kingdom; and there is no kingdom in which there is no space, either a greater or a lesser kingdom. ³⁸And unto every kingdom is given a law; and unto every law there are certain bounds also and conditions. ³⁹All beings who abide not in those conditions are not justified.

⁴⁰For intelligence cleaveth unto intelligence; wisdom receiveth wisdom; truth embraceth truth; virtue loveth virtue; light cleaveth unto light; mercy hath compassion on mercy and claimeth her own; justice continueth its course and claimeth its own;

judgment goeth before the face of him who sitteth upon the throne and governeth and executeth all things. ⁴⁷He comprehendeth all things, and all things are before him, and all things are round about him; and he is above all things, and in all things, and is through all things, and is round about all things; and all things are by him, and of him, even God, forever and ever.

⁴²And again, verily I say unto you, he hath given a law unto all things, by which they move in their times and their seasons; ⁴³And their courses are fixed, even the courses of the heavens and the earth, which comprehend the earth and all the planets. ⁴⁴And they give light to each other in their times and in their seasons, in their minutes, in their hours, in their days, in their weeks, in their months, in their years—all these are one year with

God, but not with man. ⁴⁵The earth rolls upon her wings, and the sun giveth his light by day, and the moon giveth her light by night, and the stars also give their light, as they roll upon their wings in their glory, in the midst of the power of God.

Parable of the twelve servants

⁴⁶Unto what shall I liken these kingdoms, that ye may understand? ⁴⁷Behold, all these are kingdoms, and any man who hath seen any or the least of these hath seen God moving in his majesty and power. ⁴⁶I say unto you, he hath seen him; nevertheless, he who came unto his own was not comprehended. ⁴⁹The light shineth in darkness, and the darkness comprehendeth it not; nevertheless, the day shall come when you shall comprehend even God, being quickened in him and by him. ⁵⁰Then shall ye know that ye have seen me, that I am, and that I am the true light that is in you, and that you are in me; otherwise ye could not abound.

⁵¹Behold, I will liken these kingdoms unto a man having a field, and he sent forth his servants into the field to dig in the field. ⁵²And he said unto the first: Go ye and labor in the field, and in the first hour I will come unto you, and ye shall behold the joy of my countenance. ⁵³And he said unto the second: Go ye also into the field, and in the second hour I will visit you with the joy of my countenance. ⁵⁴And also unto the third, saying: I will visit you; ⁵⁵And unto the fourth, and so on unto the twelfth.

⁵⁶And the lord of the field went unto the first in the first hour, and tarried with him all that hour, and he was made glad with the light of the countenance of his lord. ⁵⁷And then he withdrew from the first that he might visit the second also, and the third, and the fourth, and so on unto the twelfth. ⁵⁸And thus they all received the light of the countenance of their lord, every man in his hour, and in his time, and in his season—⁵⁹Beginning at the first, and so on unto the last, and from the last unto the first, and from the first unto the last; ⁶⁰Every man in his own order, until his hour was finished, even according as his lord had commanded him, that his lord might be glorified in him, and he in his lord, that they all might be glorified.

^{6†}Therefore, unto this parable I will liken all these kingdoms, and the inhabitants thereof—every kingdom in its hour, and in its time, and in its season, even according to the decree which God hath made.

⁶²And again, verily I say unto you, my friends, I leave these sayings with you to ponder in your hearts, with this commandment which I give unto you, that ye shall call upon me while I am near— ⁶³Draw near unto me and I will draw near unto you; seek me diligently and ye shall find me; ask, and ye shall receive; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. ⁶⁴Whatsoever ye ask the Father in my name it shall be given unto you, that is expedient for you; ⁶⁵And if ye ask anything that is not expedient for you, it shall turn unto your condemnation.

⁶⁹Remember the great and last promise which I have made unto you; ^b cast away your idle thoughts and your excess of laughter far from you. ⁷⁰Tarry ye, tarry ye in this place, and call a solemn assembly, ^c even of those who are the first laborers in this last kingdom. ⁷¹And let those whom they have warned in their traveling call on the Lord, and ponder the warning in their hearts which they have received, for a little season. ⁷²Behold, and lo, I will take care of your flocks, and will raise up elders and send unto them. ⁷³Behold, I will hasten my work in its time. ⁷⁴And I give unto you, who are the first laborers in this last kingdom, a commandment that you assemble yourselves together, and organize yourselves, and prepare yourselves, and sanctify yourselves; yea, purify your hearts, and cleanse your hands and your feet before me, that I may make you clean; ⁷⁵That I may testify unto your Father, and your God, and my God, that you are clean from the blood

⁷⁶Also, I give unto you a commandment that ye shall continue in prayer and fasting from this time forth. ⁷⁷And I give unto you a commandment that you shall teach one another the doctrine of the kingdom. ^b ⁷⁸Teach ye diligently and my grace shall attend you, that you may be instructed more perfectly in theory, in principle, in doctrine, in the law of the gospel, in all things that pertain unto the kingdom of God, that are expedient for you to understand; ⁷⁹Of things both in heaven and in the earth, and under the earth; things which have been, things which are, things which must shortly come to pass; things which are at home, things which are abroad; the wars and the perplexities of the nations, and the judgments which are on the land; and a knowledge also of countries and of kingdoms— ⁸⁰That ye may be prepared in all things when I shall send you again to magnify the calling whereunto I have called you, and the mission with which I have commissioned you.

⁸¹Behold, I sent you out to testify and warn the people, and it becometh every man who hath been warned to warn his neighbor. ⁸²Therefore, they are left without excuse, ^c and their sins are upon their own heads. ⁸³He that seeketh me early shall find me, and shall not be forsaken. ⁸⁴Therefore, tarry ye, and labor diligently, that you may be perfected in your ministry to go forth among the Gentiles for the last time, as many as the mouth of the Lord shall name, ^d to bind up the law and seal up the testimony, and to prepare the saints for the hour of judgment which is to come; ⁸⁵That their souls may escape the wrath of God, the desolation of abomination which awaits the wicked, both in this world and in the world to come.

Verily, I say unto you, let those who are not the first elders continue in the vineyard until the mouth of the Lord shall call them, for their time is not yet come; their garments are not clean from the blood of this generation. ⁸⁶Abide ye in the liberty wherewith ye are made free; entangle not yourselves in sin, but let your hands be clean, until the Lord comes.

⁸⁷For not many days hence and the earth shall tremble and reel to and fro as a drunken man; and the sun shall hide his face, and shall refuse to give light; and the moon shall be bathed in blood; and the stars shall become exceedingly angry, and shall cast themselves down as a fig that falleth from off a fig-tree. ⁸⁸And after your testimony cometh wrath and indignation upon the people. ⁸⁹For after your testimony cometh the testimony of earthquakes, that shall cause groanings in the midst of her, and men shall fall upon the ground and shall not be able to stand. ⁹⁰And also cometh the testimony of the voice of thunderings, and the voice of lightnings, and the voice of tempests, and the voice of the waves of the sea heaving themselves beyond their bounds. ⁹¹And all things shall be in commotion; and surely, men's hearts shall fail them; for fear shall come upon all people.

⁹²And angels shall fly through the midst of heaven, crying with a loud voice, sounding the trump of God, saying: Prepare ye, prepare ye, O inhabitants of the earth; for the judgment of our God is come. Behold, and lo, the Bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him. ⁹³And immediately there shall appear a great sign in heaven, and all people shall see it together.

⁹⁴And another angel shall sound his trump, saying: That great church, the mother of abominations, that made all nations drink of the wine of the wrath of her fornication, that persecuteth the saints of God, that shed their blood—she who sitteth upon many waters, and upon the islands of the sea—behold, she is the tares of the earth; she is bound in bundles; her bands are made strong, no man can loose them; therefore, she is ready to be burned. And he shall sound his trump both long and loud, and all nations shall hear it. 95 And there shall be silence in heaven for the space of half an hour; and immediately after shall the curtain of heaven be unfolded, as a scroll is unfolded after it is rolled up, and the face of the Lord shall be unveiled; 96And the saints that are upon the earth, who are alive, shall be quickened and be caught up to meet him. 97And they who have slept in their graves shall come forth, for their graves shall be opened; and they also shall be caught up to meet him in the midst of the pillar of heaven— ⁹⁸They are Christ's, the first fruits, they who shall descend with him first, and they who are on the earth and in their graves, who are first caught up to meet him; and all this by the voice of the sounding of the trump of the angel of God.

⁹⁹And after this another angel shall sound, which is the second trump; and then cometh the redemption of those who are Christ's at his coming;

who have received their part in that prison which is prepared for them, that they might receive the gospel, and be judged according to men in the flesh.

¹⁰⁰And again, another trump shall sound, which is the third trump; and then come the spirits of men who are to be judged, and are found under condemnation; ¹⁰¹And these are the rest of the dead; and they live not again until the thousand years are ended, neither again, until the end of the earth.

¹⁰²And another trump shall sound, which is the fourth trump, saying: There are found among those who are to remain until that great and last day, even the end, who shall remain filthy still.

¹⁰³And another trump shall sound, which is the fifth trump, which is the fifth angel who committeth the everlasting gospel—flying through the midst of heaven, unto all nations, kindreds, tongues, and people; ¹⁰⁴And this shall be the sound of his trump, saying to all people, both in heaven and in earth, and that are under the earth—for every ear shall hear it, and every knee shall bow, and every tongue shall confess, while they hear the sound of the trump, saying: Fear God, and give glory to him who sitteth upon the throne, forever and ever; for the hour of his judgment is come.

¹⁰⁵And again, another angel shall sound his trump, which is the sixth angel, saying: She is fallen who made all nations drink of the wine of the wrath of her fornication; she is fallen, is fallen!

The Lamb of God hath overcome and trodden the wine-press alone, even the wine-press of the fierceness of the wrath of Almighty God.^a ¹⁰⁷And then shall the angels be crowned with the glory of his might, and the saints shall be filled with his glory, and receive their inheritance and be made equal with him.

¹⁰⁸And then shall the first angel again sound his trump in the ears of all living, and reveal the secret acts of men, and the mighty works of God in the first thousand years. ¹⁰⁹And then shall the second angel sound his trump, and reveal the secret acts of men, and the thoughts and intents of their hearts, and the mighty works of God in the second thousand years—¹¹⁰And so on, until the seventh angel shall sound his trump; and he shall stand forth upon the land and upon the sea, and swear in the name of him who sitteth upon the throne, that there shall be time no longer; and Satan shall be bound, that old serpent, who is called the devil, and shall not be loosed for the space of a thousand years.

Forbidden: Not for the belly

⁴Behold, verily, thus saith the Lord unto you: In consequence of evils and designs which do and will exist in the hearts of conspiring men in the last days, I have warned you, and forewarn you, by giving unto you this word of wisdom by revelation— ⁵That inasmuch as any man drinketh wine

⁷And, again, strong drinks are not for the belly, but for the washing of your bodies.

⁸And again, tobacco is not for the body, neither for the belly, and is not good for man, but is an herb for bruises and all sick cattle, to be used with judgment and skill.

⁹And again, hot drinks are not for the body or belly.

Recommended: What God has ordained

¹⁰And again, verily I say unto you, all wholesome herbs God hath ordained for the constitution, nature, and use of man— ¹¹Every herb in the season thereof, and every fruit in the season thereof; all these to be used with prudence and thanksgiving.

¹²Yea, flesh also of beasts and of the fowls of the air, I, the Lord, have ordained for the use of man with thanksgiving; nevertheless they are to be used sparingly; ¹³And it is pleasing unto me that they should not be used, only in times of winter, or of cold, or famine.

¹⁴All grain is ordained for the use of man and of beasts, to be the staff of life, not only for man but for the beasts of the field, and the fowls of heaven, and all wild animals that run or creep on the earth; ¹⁵And these hath God made for the use of man only in times of famine and excess of hunger. ¹⁶All grain is good for the food of man; as also the fruit of the vine; that which yieldeth fruit, whether in the ground or above the ground—¹⁷Nevertheless, wheat for man, and corn for the ox, and oats for the horse, and rye for the fowls and for swine, and for all beasts of the field, and barley for all useful animals, and for mild drinks, as also other grain.

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[†]Thus saith the Lord, verily, verily I say unto you my son, ^c thy sins are forgiven thee, according to thy petition, for thy prayers and the prayers of thy brethren have come up into my ears. ²Therefore, thou art blessed from henceforth that bear the keys of the kingdom given unto you; ^d which kingdom is coming forth for the last time. ³Verily I say unto you, the keys of this kingdom shall never be taken from you, while thou art in the world, neither in the world to come; ⁴Nevertheless, through you shall the oracles be given to another, yea, even unto the church. ⁵And all they who receive the oracles of God, let them beware how they hold them lest they are accounted as a light thing, and are brought under condemnation thereby, and stumble and fall when the storms descend, and the winds blow, and the rains descend, and beat upon their house.

⁶And again, verily I say unto thy brethren, Sidney Rigdon and Frederick G. Williams, their sins are forgiven them also, and they are accounted as equal with thee in holding the keys of this last kingdom; ^e ⁷As also through your administration the keys of the school of the prophets, which I have commanded to be organized; ^f That thereby they may be perfected in their ministry for the salvation of Zion, and of the nations of Israel, and of the Gentiles, as many as will believe; ⁹That through your administration they may receive the word, and through their administration the word may go forth unto the ends of the earth, unto the Gentiles first, and then, behold, and lo, they shall turn unto the Jews. ¹⁰And then cometh the day when the arm of the Lord shall be revealed in power in convincing the nations, the heathen nations, the house of Joseph, of the gospel of their salvation. ¹¹For it shall come to pass in that day, that every man shall hear the fulness of

^{2†}Therefore, verily, thus saith the Lord, let Zion rejoice, for this is Zion—The PURE IN HEART; therefore, let Zion rejoice, while all the wicked shall mourn. ²²For behold, and lo, vengeance cometh speedily upon the ungodly as the whirlwind; and who shall escape it? ²³The Lord's scourge shall pass over by night and by day, and the report thereof shall vex all people; yea, it shall not be stayed until the Lord come; ²⁴For the indignation of the Lord is kindled against their abominations and all their wicked works.

²⁵Nevertheless, Zion shall escape if she observe to do all things whatsoever I have commanded her. ²⁶But if she observe not to do whatsoever I have commanded her, I will visit her according to all her works, with sore affliction, with pestilence, with plague, with sword, with vengeance, with devouring fire.

²⁷Nevertheless, let it be read this once to her ears, that I, the Lord, have accepted of her offering; and if she sin no more none of these things shall come upon her; ²⁸And I will bless her with blessings, and multiply a multiplicity of blessings upon her, and upon her generations forever and ever, saith the Lord your God. Amen.



Verily I say unto you my friends, fear not, let your hearts be comforted; yea, rejoice evermore, and in everything give thanks; ²Waiting patiently on the Lord, for your prayers have entered into the ears of the Lord of Sabaoth, and are recorded with this seal and testament—the Lord hath sworn and decreed that they shall be granted. ³Therefore, he giveth this promise unto you, with an immutable covenant that they shall be fulfilled; and all things wherewith you have been afflicted shall work together for your good, and to my name's glory, saith the Lord.

⁴And now, verily I say unto you concerning the laws of the land, it is my will that my people should observe to do all things whatsoever I command them. ⁵And that law of the land which is constitutional, supporting that principle of freedom in maintaining rights and privileges, belongs to all mankind, and is justifiable before me. ⁶Therefore, I, the Lord, justify you, and your brethren of my church, in befriending that law which is the





constitutional law of the land; ⁷And as pertaining to law of man, what-soever is more or less than this, cometh of evil. ⁸I, the Lord God, make you free, therefore ye are free indeed; and the law also maketh you free. ⁹Nevertheless, when the wicked rule the people mourn. ¹⁰Wherefore, honest men and wise men should be sought for diligently, and good men and wise men ye should observe to uphold; otherwise whatsoever is less than these cometh of evil.

¹⁷And I give unto you a commandment, that ye shall forsake all evil and cleave unto all good, that ye shall live by every word which proceedeth forth out of the mouth of God. ¹²For he will give unto the faithful line upon line, precept upon precept; and I will try you and prove you herewith. ¹³And whoso layeth down his life in my cause, for my name's sake, shall find it again, even life eternal. ¹⁴Therefore, be not afraid of your enemies, for I have decreed in my heart, saith the Lord, that I will prove you in all things, whether you will abide in my covenant, even unto death, that you may be found worthy. ¹⁵For if ye will not abide in my covenant ye are not worthy of me.

¹⁶Therefore, renounce war and proclaim peace, and seek diligently to turn the hearts of the children to their fathers, and the hearts of the fathers to the children; ¹⁷And again, the hearts of the Jews unto the prophets, and the prophets unto the Jews; lest I come and smite the whole earth with a curse, and all flesh be consumed before me. ¹⁸Let not your hearts be troubled; for in my Father's house are many mansions, and I have prepared a place for you; and where my Father and I am, there ye shall be also.

¹⁹Behold, I, the Lord, am not well pleased with many who are in the church at Kirtland; ²⁰For they do not forsake their sins, and their wicked

ways, the pride of their hearts, and their covetousness, and all their detestable things, and observe the words of wisdom and eternal life which I have given unto them. ^{a 21}Verily I say unto you, that I, the Lord, will chasten them and will do whatsoever I list, if they do not repent and observe all things whatsoever I have said unto them. ²²And again I say unto you, if ye observe to do whatsoever I command you, I, the Lord, will turn away all wrath and indignation from you, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against you.

Vengeance and forgiveness families

²³Now, I speak unto you concerning your families—

- if men will smite you, or your families, once, and ye bear it patiently and revile not against them, neither seek revenge, ye shall be rewarded; ²⁴But if ye bear it not patiently, it shall be accounted unto you as being meted out as a just measure unto you.
- ²⁵And again, if your enemy shall smite you the second time, and you revile not against your enemy, and bear it patiently, your reward shall be an hundred fold.
- ²⁶And again, if he shall smite you the third time, and ye bear it patiently, your reward shall be doubled unto you four-fold;

²⁷And these three testimonies shall stand against your enemy if he repent not, and shall not be blotted out.

²⁸And now, verily I say unto you, if that enemy shall escape my vengeance, that he be not brought into judgment before me, then ye shall see to it that ye warn him in my name, that he come no more upon you, neither upon your family, even your children's children unto the third and fourth generation. ²⁹And then, if he shall come upon you or your children, or your children's children unto the third and fourth generation, I have delivered thine enemy into thine hands; ³⁰And then if thou wilt spare him, thou shalt be rewarded for thy righteousness; and also thy children and thy children's children unto the third and fourth generation. ³¹Nevertheless, thine enemy is in thine hands; and if thou rewardest him according to his works thou art justified; if he has sought thy life, and thy life is endangered by him, thine enemy is in thine hands and thou art justified.

³²Behold, this is the law I gave unto my servant Nephi, ^a and thy fathers, Joseph, and Jacob, and Isaac, and Abraham, ^b and all mine ancient prophets and apostles.

³³And again, this is the law that I gave unto mine ancients,^c that they should not go out unto battle against any nation, kindred, tongue, or people, save I, the Lord, commanded them. ³⁴And if any nation, tongue, or people should proclaim war against them, they should first lift a standard of peace unto that people, nation, or tongue; ³⁵And if that people did not accept the offering of peace, neither the second nor the third time, they should bring these testimonies before the Lord; ³⁶Then I, the Lord, would give unto them a commandment, and justify them in going out to battle against that nation, tongue, or people. ³⁷And I, the Lord, would fight their battles, and their children's battles, and their children's children's, until they had avenged themselves on all their enemies, to the third and fourth generation. ³⁶Behold, this is an ensample unto all people, saith the Lord your God, for justification before me.

Forgiving trespasses___

³⁹And again, verily I say unto you, if after thine enemy has come upon thee the first time, he repent and come unto thee praying thy forgiveness, thou shalt forgive him, and shalt hold it no more as a testimony against thine enemy— ⁴⁰And so on unto the second and third time; and as oft as thine enemy repenteth of the trespass wherewith he has trespassed against thee, thou shalt forgive him, until seventy times seven.

⁴¹And if he trespass against thee and repent not the first time, nevertheless thou shalt forgive him. ⁴²And if he trespass against thee the second time, and repent not, nevertheless thou shalt forgive him. ⁴³And if he trespass against thee the third time, and repent not, thou shalt also forgive him. ⁴⁴But if he trespass against thee the fourth time thou shalt not forgive him, but shalt bring these testimonies before the Lord; and they shall not be blotted out until he repent and reward thee four-fold in all things wherewith he has trespassed against thee. ⁴⁵And if he do this, thou shalt forgive him with all thine heart; and if he do not this, I, the Lord, will avenge thee of thine enemy an hundred-fold; ⁴⁶And upon his children, and upon his children's children of all them that hate me, unto the third and fourth generation.

Behold, thus saith the Lord unto my servant John Murdock—thou art called to go into the eastern countries from house to house, from village to village, and from city to city, to proclaim mine everlasting gospel^a unto the inhabitants thereof, in the midst of persecution and wickedness. ²And who receiveth you receiveth me; and you shall have power to declare my word in the demonstration of my Holy Spirit. ³And who receiveth you as a little child, receiveth my kingdom; and blessed are they, for they shall obtain mercy. ⁴And whoso rejecteth you shall be rejected of my Father and his house; and you shall cleanse your feet in the secret places by the way for a testimony against them. ^b ⁵And behold, and lo, I come quickly to judgment, to convince all of their ungodly deeds which they have committed against me, as it is written of me in the volume of the book.^c

⁶And now, verily I say unto you, that it is not expedient that you should go until your children are provided for, and sent up kindly unto the bishop of Zion. ^{d 7}And after a few years, if thou desirest of me, thou mayest go up also unto the goodly land, to possess thine inheritance; ⁸Otherwise thou shalt continue proclaiming my gospel until thou be taken. Amen.

Verily, thus saith the Lord unto you, my friends Sidney and Joseph, your families are well; they are in mine hands, and I will do with them as seemeth me good; for in me there is all power. Therefore, follow me, and listen to the counsel which I shall give unto you.

³Behold, and lo, I have much people in this place, in the regions round about; and an effectual door shall be opened^a in the regions round about in this eastern land. ⁴Therefore, I, the Lord, have suffered you to come unto this place;^b for thus it was expedient in me for the salvation of souls. ⁵Therefore, verily I say unto you, lift up your voices unto this people; speak the thoughts that I shall put into your hearts, and you shall not be confounded before men; ⁶For it shall be given you in the very hour, yea, in the very moment, what ye shall say. ⁷But a commandment I give unto you, that ye shall declare whatsoever thing ye declare in my name, in solemnity of heart, in the spirit of meekness, in all things. ⁸And I give unto you this promise, that inasmuch as ye do this the Holy Ghost shall be shed forth in bearing record unto all things whatsoever ye shall say.

⁹And it is expedient in me that you, my servant Sidney, should be a spokesman unto this people; yea, verily, I will ordain you unto this calling, even to be a spokesman unto my servant Joseph.^c ¹⁰And I will give unto him power to be mighty in testimony. ¹¹And I will give unto thee power to be mighty in expounding all scriptures, that thou mayest be a spokesman unto him, and he shall be a revelator unto thee, that thou mayest know the certainty of all things pertaining to the things of my kingdom on the earth. ¹²Therefore, continue your journey and let your hearts rejoice; for behold, and lo, I am with you even unto the end.

¹³And now I give unto you a word concerning Zion. Zion shall be redeemed, although she is chastened for a little season.^d ¹⁴Thy brethren, my servants Orson Hyde and John Gould, are in my hands; and inasmuch as they keep my commandments they shall be saved. ¹⁵Therefore, let your hearts be comforted; for all things shall work together for good to them

¹Verily I say unto you, concerning your brethren who have been afflicted, and persecuted, and cast out from the land of their inheritance—
²I, the Lord, have suffered the affliction to come upon them, wherewith they have been afflicted, in consequence of their transgressions; ³Yet I will own them, and they shall be mine in that day when I shall come to make up my jewels.^a ⁴Therefore, they must needs be chastened and tried, even as Abraham, who was commanded to offer up his only son.^b ⁵For all those who will not endure chastening, but deny me, cannot be sanctified.

⁶Behold, I say unto you, there were jarrings, and contentions, and envyings, and strifes, and lustful and covetous desires among them; therefore by these things they polluted their inheritances.^c ⁷They were slow to hearken unto the voice of the Lord their God; therefore, the Lord their God is slow to hearken unto their prayers, to answer them in the day of their trouble. ⁸In the day of their peace they esteemed lightly my counsel; but, in the day of their trouble, of necessity they feel after me.

⁹Verily I say unto you, notwithstanding their sins, my bowels are filled with compassion towards them. I will not utterly cast them off; and in the day of wrath I will remember mercy. ¹⁰I have sworn, and the decree hath gone forth by a former commandment which I have given unto you, ^d that I would let fall the sword of mine indignation in behalf of my people; and even as I have said, it shall come to pass. ¹¹Mine indignation is soon to be poured out without measure upon all nations; and this will I do when the cup of their iniquity is full.

¹²And in that day all who are found upon the watch-tower, or in other words, all mine Israel, shall be saved. ¹³And they that have been scattered shall be gathered. ¹⁴And all they who have mourned shall be comforted. ¹⁵And all they who have given their lives for my name shall be crowned. ¹⁶Therefore, let your hearts be comforted concerning Zion; for all flesh is in mine hands; be still and know that I am God. ¹⁷Zion shall not be moved out of her place, notwithstanding her children are scattered. ¹⁸They that remain, and are pure in heart, shall return, and come to their inheritances, they and their children, with songs of everlasting joy, to build up the waste places of Zion— ¹⁹And all these things that the prophets might be fulfilled.^a

²⁰And, behold, there is none other place appointed than that which I have appointed;^b neither shall there be any other place appointed than that which I have appointed, for the work of the gathering of my saints—²⁷Until the day cometh when there is found no more room for them; and then I have other places which I will appoint unto them,^c and they shall be called stakes, for the curtains or the strength of Zion.^d

²²Behold, it is my will, that all they who call on my name, and worship me according to mine everlasting gospel, should gather together, and stand in holy places; ²³And prepare for the revelation which is to come, when the veil of the covering of my temple, in my tabernacle, which hideth the earth, shall be taken off, and all flesh shall see me together. ²⁴And every corruptible thing, both of man, or of the beasts of the field, or of the fowls of the heavens, or of the fish of the sea, that dwells upon all the face of the earth, shall be consumed; ²⁵And also that of element shall melt with fervent heat; and all things shall become new, that my knowledge and glory may dwell upon all the earth.

²⁶And in that day the enmity of man, and the enmity of beasts, yea, the enmity of all flesh, ^e shall cease from before my face.

²⁷And in that day whatsoever any man shall ask, it shall be given unto him.

²⁸And in that day Satan shall not have power to tempt any man. ²⁹And there shall be no sorrow because there is no death.

³⁰In that day an infant shall not die until he is old; and his life shall be as the age of a tree; ³¹And when he dies he shall not sleep, that is to say in the earth, but shall be changed in the twinkling of an eye, and shall be caught up, and his rest shall be glorious.

³²Yea, verily I say unto you, in that day when the Lord shall come, he shall reveal all things— ³³Things which have passed, and hidden things which no man knew, things of the earth, by which it was made, and the purpose and the end thereof— ³⁴Things most precious, things that are above, and things that are beneath, things that are in the earth, and upon the earth, and in heaven. ³⁵And all they who suffer persecution for my name, and endure in faith, though they are called to lay down their lives for my sake yet shall they partake of all this glory.

³⁶Wherefore, fear not even unto death; for in this world your joy is not full, but in me your joy is full. ³⁷Therefore, care not for the body, neither the life of the body; but care for the soul, and for the life of the soul. ³⁸And seek the face of the Lord always, that in patience ye may possess your souls, and ye shall have eternal life.

³⁹When men are called unto mine everlasting gospel, and covenant with an everlasting covenant, they are accounted as the salt of the earth and the savor of men; ⁴⁰They are called to be the savor of men; therefore, if that salt of the earth lose its savor, behold, it is thenceforth good for nothing only to be cast out and trodden under the feet of men.

⁴¹Behold, here is wisdom concerning the children of Zion, even many, but not all; they were found transgressors, therefore they must needs be chastened— ⁴²He that exalteth himself shall be abased, and he that abaseth himself shall be exalted.

The redemption of Zion

⁴³And now, I will show unto you a parable,^a that you may know my will concerning the redemption of Zion.

Parable of the vineyard watchtower

⁴⁴A certain nobleman had a spot of land, very choice; and he said unto his servants: Go ye unto my vineyard, even upon this very choice piece of land, and plant twelve olive-trees; ⁴⁵And set watchmen round about them,

and build a tower, that one may overlook the land round about,^a to be a watchman upon the tower, that mine olive-trees may not be broken down when the enemy shall come to spoil and take upon themselves the fruit of my vineyard.

⁴⁶Now, the servants of the nobleman went and did as their lord commanded them, and planted the olive-trees, and built a hedge round about, and set watchmen, and began to build a tower. ⁴⁷And while they were yet laying the foundation thereof, they began to say among themselves: And what need hath my lord of this tower? ⁴⁸And consulted for a long time, saying among themselves: What need hath my lord of this tower, seeing this is a time of peace? ⁴⁹Might not this money be given to the exchangers? For there is no need of these things. ^b ⁵⁰And while they were at variance one with another they became very slothful, and they hearkened not unto the commandments of their lord.

⁵¹And the enemy came by night, and broke down the hedge;^c and the servants of the nobleman arose and were affrighted, and fled; and the enemy destroyed their works, and broke down the olive-trees.

⁵²Now, behold, the nobleman, the lord of the vineyard, called upon his servants, and said unto them, Why! what is the cause of this great evil? ⁵³Ought ye not to have done even as I commanded you, and—after ye had planted the vineyard, and built the hedge round about, and set watchmen upon the walls thereof—built the tower also, and set a watchman upon the tower, and watched for my vineyard, and not have fallen asleep, lest the enemy should come upon you? ⁵⁴And behold, the watchman upon the tower would have seen the enemy while he was yet afar off; and then ye could have made ready and kept the enemy from breaking down the hedge thereof, and saved my vineyard from the hands of the destroyer.

⁵⁵And the lord of the vineyard said unto one of his servants:^d Go and gather together the residue of my servants, and take all the strength of mine house, which are my warriors, my young men, and they that are of middle age also among all my servants, who are the strength of mine house, save those only whom I have appointed to tarry; ⁵⁶And go ye straightway unto

the land of my vineyard, and redeem my vineyard; for it is mine; I have bought it with money. ⁵⁷Therefore, get ye straightway unto my land; break down the walls of mine enemies; throw down their tower, and scatter their watchmen. ⁵⁸And inasmuch as they gather together against you, avenge me of mine enemies, ^a that by and by I may come with the residue of mine house and possess the land.

⁵⁹And the servant said unto his lord: When shall these things be?

⁶⁰And he said unto his servant: When I will; ^b go ye straightway, and do all things whatsoever I have commanded you; ⁶¹And this shall be my seal and blessing upon you—a faithful and wise steward in the midst of mine house, a ruler in my kingdom.

⁶²And his servant went straightway, and did all things whatsoever his lord commanded him; and after many days all things were fulfilled.

Purchasing more land^c

⁶³Again, verily I say unto you, I will show unto you wisdom in me concerning all the churches, inasmuch as they are willing to be guided in a right and proper way for their salvation— ⁶⁴That the work of the gathering together of my saints may continue, that I may build them up unto my name upon holy places; for the time of harvest is come, and my word must needs be fulfilled. ⁶⁵Therefore, I must gather together my people, according to the parable of the wheat and the tares, ⁴ that the wheat may be secured in the garners to possess eternal life, and be crowned with celestial glory, when I shall come in the kingdom of my Father to reward every man according as his work shall be; ⁶⁶While the tares shall be bound in bundles, and their bands made strong, that they may be burned with unquenchable fire.

⁶⁷Therefore, a commandment I give unto all the churches, that they shall continue to gather together unto the places which I have appointed. ^e ⁶⁸Nevertheless, as I have said unto you in a former commandment, flet not your gathering be in haste, nor by flight; but let all things be prepared before you. ⁶⁹And in order that all things be prepared before you,

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observe the commandment which I have given concerning these things^a— ⁷⁰Which saith, or teacheth, to purchase all the lands^b with money, which can be purchased for money, in the region round about the land which I have appointed to be the land of Zion, for the beginning of the gathering of my saints; ⁷¹All the land which can be purchased in Jackson county, and the counties round about, and leave the residue in mine hand.

⁷²Now, verily I say unto you, let all the churches gather together all their moneys; let these things be done in their time, but not in haste; and observe to have all things prepared before you. ⁷³And let honorable men be appointed, even wise men, and send them to purchase these lands. ⁶ ⁷⁴And the churches in the eastern countries, when they are built up, if they will hearken unto this counsel they may buy lands and gather together upon them; and in this way they may establish Zion. ⁷⁵There is even now already in store sufficient, yea, even an abundance, to redeem Zion, and establish her waste places, no more to be thrown down, were the churches, who call themselves after my name, willing to hearken to my voice.

Redress for lost land

⁷⁶And again I say unto you, those who have been scattered by their enemies, it is my will that they should continue to importune for redress, and redemption, by the hands of those who are placed as rulers and are in authority over you— ⁷⁷According to the laws and constitution of the people, which I have suffered to be established, and should be maintained for the rights and protection of all flesh, according to just and holy principles; ⁷⁸That every man may act in doctrine and principle pertaining to futurity, according to the moral agency which I have given unto him, that every man may be accountable for his own sins in the day of judgment. ⁷⁹Therefore, it is not right that any man should be in bondage one to another. ⁸⁰And for this purpose have I established the Constitution of this land, by the hands of wise men whom I raised up unto this very purpose, and redeemed the land by the shedding of blood.

⁸⁷Now, unto what shall I liken the children of Zion? I will liken them unto the parable of the woman and the unjust judge,^d for men ought always to pray and not to faint, which saith—

⁸²There was in a city a judge which feared not God, neither regarded man. ⁸³And there was a widow in that city, and she came unto him, saying: Avenge me of mine adversary. ⁸⁴And he would not for a while, but afterward he said within himself: Though I fear not God, nor regard man, yet because this widow troubleth me I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me.

⁸⁵Thus will I liken the children of Zion. ⁸⁶Let them importune at the feet of the judge; ⁸⁷And if he heed them not, let them importune at the feet of the governor; ⁸⁸And if the governor heed them not, let them importune at the feet of the president; ⁸⁹And if the president heed them not, then will the Lord arise and come forth out of his hiding place, and in his fury vex the nation; ⁹⁰And in his hot displeasure, and in his fierce anger, in his time, will cut off those wicked, unfaithful, and unjust stewards, and appoint them their portion among hypocrites, and unbelievers; ⁹¹Even in outer darkness, where there is weeping, and wailing, and gnashing of teeth. ⁹²Pray ye, therefore, that their ears may be opened unto your cries, that I may be merciful unto them, that these things may not come upon them.

⁹³What I have said unto you must needs be, that all men may be left without excuse;^a ⁹⁴That wise men and rulers may hear and know that which they have never considered; ⁹⁵That I may proceed to bring to pass my act, my strange act, and perform my work, my strange work, that men may discern between the righteous and the wicked, saith your God.

⁹⁶And again, I say unto you, it is contrary to my commandment^b and my will that my servant Sidney Gilbert should sell my storehouse, which I have appointed unto my people,^c into the hands of mine enemies. ⁹⁷Let not that which I have appointed be polluted by mine enemies,^d by the consent of those who call themselves after my name; ⁹⁸For this is a very sore and grievous sin against me, and against my people, in consequence of those things which I have decreed and which are soon to befall the nations. ⁹⁹Therefore, it is my will that my people should claim, and hold claim upon that which I have appointed unto them, though they should not be permitted to dwell thereon. ¹⁰⁰Nevertheless, I do not say they shall not dwell thereon; for inasmuch as they bring forth fruit and works meet for my kingdom they shall

dwell thereon. ¹⁰¹They shall build, and another shall not inherit it; they shall plant vineyards, and they shall eat the fruit thereof.

THE HIGH COUNCIL

17 February 1834 ← Kirtland, Ohio

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[†]This day a general council of twenty-four high priests assembled at the house of Joseph Smith, Jun., by revelation, and proceeded to organize the high council of the church of Christ, which was to consist of twelve high priests, and one or three presidents as the case might require. ²The high council was appointed by revelation for the purpose of settling important difficulties which might arise in the church, which could not be settled by the church or the bishop's council to the satisfaction of the parties.

³Joseph Smith, Jun., Sidney Rigdon and Frederick G. Williams were acknowledged presidents by the voice of the council; and Joseph Smith, Sen., John Smith, Joseph Coe, John Johnson, Martin Harris, John S. Carter, Jared Carter, Oliver Cowdery, Samuel H. Smith, Orson Hyde, Sylvester Smith, and Luke Johnson, high priests, were chosen to be a standing council for the church, by the unanimous voice of the council. ⁴The above-named councilors were then asked whether they accepted their appointments, and whether they would act in that office according to the law of heaven, to which they all answered that they accepted their appointments, and would fill their offices according to the grace of God bestowed upon them. ⁵The number composing the council, who voted in the name and for the church in appointing the above-named councilors were forty-three, as follows: nine high priests, seventeen elders, four priests, and thirteen members.

⁶Voted: that the high council cannot have power to act without seven of the above-named councilors, or their regularly appointed successors are present. ⁷These seven shall have power to appoint other high priests, whom they may consider worthy and capable to act in the place of absent councilors.

⁸Voted: that whenever any vacancy shall occur by the death, removal from office for transgression, or removal from the bounds of this church government, of any one of the above-named councilors, it shall be filled by the nomination of the president or presidents, and sanctioned by the voice of a general council of high priests, convened for that purpose, to act in the name of the church.

⁹The president of the church, who is also the president of the council, is appointed by revelation, and acknowledged in his administration by the voice of the church. ¹⁰And it is according to the dignity of his office that he should preside over the council of the church; and it is his privilege to be assisted by two other presidents, appointed after the same manner that he himself was appointed. ¹¹And in case of the absence of one or both of those who are appointed to assist him, he has power to preside over the council without an assistant; and in case he himself is absent, the other presidents have power to preside in his stead, both or either of them.

¹²Whenever a high council of the church of Christ is regularly organized, according to the foregoing pattern, it shall be the duty of the twelve councilors to cast lots by numbers, and thereby ascertain who of the twelve shall speak first, commencing with number one and so in succession to number twelve. ¹³Whenever this council convenes to act upon any case, the twelve councilors shall consider whether it is a difficult one or not; if it is not, two only of the councilors shall speak upon it, according to the form above written. ¹⁴But if it is thought to be difficult, four shall be appointed; and if more difficult, six; but in no case shall more than six be appointed to speak.

¹⁶The accused, in all cases, has a right to one-half of the council, to prevent insult or injustice. ¹⁶And the councilors appointed to speak before the council are to present the case, after the evidence is examined, in its true light before the council; and every man is to speak according to equity and justice. ¹⁷Those councilors who draw even numbers, that is, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, and 12, are the individuals who are to stand up in behalf of the accused, and prevent insult and injustice. ¹⁸In all cases the accuser and the accused shall have a privilege of speaking for themselves before the council, after the evidences are heard and the councilors who are appointed to speak on the case have finished their remarks.

¹⁹After the evidences are heard, the councilors, accuser and accused have spoken, the president shall give a decision according to the understanding which he shall have of the case, and call upon the twelve councilors to sanction the same by their vote. ²⁰But should the remaining councilors, who have not spoken, or any one of them, after hearing the evidences and pleadings impartially, discover an error in the decision of the president, they can manifest it, and the case shall have a re-hearing. ²¹And if, after a careful re-hearing, any additional light is shown upon the case, the decision shall be altered accordingly. ²²But in case no additional light is given,

the first decision shall stand, the majority of the council having power to determine the same.

²³In case of difficulty respecting doctrine or principle, if there is not a sufficiency written to make the case clear to the minds of the council, the president may inquire and obtain the mind of the Lord by revelation.

²⁴The high priests, when abroad, have power to call and organize a council after the manner of the foregoing, to settle difficulties, when the parties or either of them shall request it. ²⁵And the said council of high priests shall have power to appoint one of their own number to preside over such council for the time being. ²⁶It shall be the duty of said council to transmit, immediately, a copy of their proceedings, with a full statement of the testimony accompanying their decision, to the high council of the seat of the First Presidency of the Church. ²⁷Should the parties or either of them be dissatisfied with the decision of said council, they may appeal to the high council of the seat of the First Presidency of the Church, and have a re-hearing, which case shall there be conducted, according to the former pattern written, as though no such decision had been made. ²⁰This council of high priests abroad is only to be called on the most difficult cases of church matters; and no common or ordinary case is to be sufficient to call such council. ²⁹The traveling or located high priests abroad have power to say whether it is necessary to call such a council or not.

³⁰There is a distinction between the high council or traveling high priests abroad, and the traveling high council^a composed of the twelve apostles, in their decisions. ³¹From the decision of the former there can be an appeal; but from the decision of the latter there cannot. ³²The latter can only be called in question by the general authorities of the church in case of transgression.^b

³³Resolved: that the president or presidents of the seat of the First Presidency of the Church shall have power to determine whether any such case, as may be appealed, is justly entitled to a re-hearing, after examining the appeal and the evidences and statements accompanying it. ³⁴The twelve

councilors then proceeded to cast lots or ballot, to ascertain who should speak first, and the following was the result, namely:

After prayer the conference adjourned.

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¹Verily I say unto you, my friends, behold, I will give unto you a revelation and commandment, that you may know how to act in the discharge of your duties concerning the salvation and redemption of your brethren, who have been scattered on the land of Zion;^a ²Being driven and smitten by the hands of mine enemies, on whom I will pour out my wrath without measure in mine own time. ³For I have suffered them thus far, that they might fill up the measure of their iniquities, that their cup might be full; ⁴And that those who call themselves after my name might be chastened for a little season with a sore and grievous chastisement, because they did not hearken altogether unto the precepts and commandments which I gave unto them.^b

⁵But verily I say unto you, that I have decreed a decree which my people shall realize, inasmuch as they hearken from this very hour unto the counsel which I, the Lord their God, shall give unto them. ⁶Behold they shall, for I have decreed it, begin to prevail against mine enemies from this very hour. ⁷And by hearkening to observe all the words which I, the Lord their God, shall speak unto them, they shall never cease to prevail until the

kingdoms of the world are subdued under my feet, and the earth is given unto the saints, to possess it forever and ever.

⁸But inasmuch as they keep not my commandments, and hearken not to observe all my words, the kingdoms of the world shall prevail against them. ⁹For they were set to be a light unto the world, and to be the saviors of men; ¹⁰And inasmuch as they are not the saviors of men, they are as salt that has lost its savor, and is thenceforth good for nothing but to be cast out and trodden under foot of men.

spake^a in the parable which I have given unto you. ^b ²²Therefore let my servant Joseph Smith, Jun. say unto the strength of my house, my young men and the middle aged—Gather yourselves together unto the land of Zion, upon the land which I have bought with money that has been consecrated unto me. ²³And let all the churches send up wise men with their moneys, and purchase lands even as I have commanded them. ^c ²⁴And inasmuch as mine enemies come against you to drive you from my goodly land, which I have consecrated to be the land of Zion, ^d even from your own lands after these testimonies, ^e which ye have brought before me against them, ye shall curse them; ²⁵And whomsoever ye curse, I will curse, and ye shall avenge me of mine enemies. ²⁶And my presence shall be with you even in avenging me of mine enemies, unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me. ^f ²⁷Let no man be afraid to lay down his life for my sake; for whoso layeth down his life for my sake shall find it again. ²⁸And whoso is not willing to lay down his life for my sake is not my disciple.

Pratt and my servant Lyman Wight should not return to the land of their brethren, until they have obtained companies to go up unto the land of Zion, by tens, or by twenties, or by fifties, or by an hundred, until they have obtained to the number of five hundred of the strength of my house. ³⁷Behold this is my will; ask and ye shall receive; but men do not always do my will. ³²Therefore, if you cannot obtain five hundred, seek diligently that peradventure you may obtain three hundred. ³³And if ye cannot obtain three hundred, seek diligently that peradventure ye may obtain one hundred. ³⁴But verily I say unto you,

³⁶Therefore, as I said unto you, ^a ask and ye shall receive; pray earnestly that peradventure my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., may go with you, and preside in the midst of my people, and organize my kingdom upon the consecrated land, and establish the children of Zion upon the laws and commandments which have been and which shall be given unto you. ^b ³⁶All victory and glory is brought to pass unto you through your diligence, faithfulness, and prayers of faith.

- ³⁷Let my servant Parley P. Pratt journey with my servant Joseph Smith, Jun.
- ³⁸Let my servant Lyman Wight journey with my servant Sidney Rigdon.

Whitney have appointed unto him the houses and lot where he now resides, and the lot and building on which the mercantile establishment stands, and also the lot which is on the corner south of the mercantile establishment, and also the lot on which the ashery is situated. ⁴⁰And all this I have appointed unto my servant Newel K. Whitney for his stewardship, for a blessing upon him and his seed after him, for the benefit of the mercantile establishment of my order which I have established for my stake in the land of Kirtland. ⁴⁷Yea, verily, this is the stewardship which I have appointed unto my servant N. K. Whitney, even this whole mercantile establishment, him and his agent, and his seed after him. ⁴²And inasmuch as he is faithful in keeping my commandments, which I have given unto him, I will multiply blessings upon him and his seed after him, even a multiplicity of blessings.

⁴³And again, let my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., have appointed unto him the lot which is laid off for the building of my house, which is forty rods long and twelve wide, and also the inheritance upon which his father now resides; ⁴⁴And this is the beginning of the stewardship which I have appointed unto him, for a blessing upon him, and upon his father. ⁴⁵For behold, I have reserved an inheritance for his father, for his support; therefore he shall be reckoned in the house of my servant Joseph Smith, Jun. ⁴⁶And I will multiply blessings upon the house of my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., inasmuch as he is faithful, even a multiplicity of blessings.

⁴⁷And now, a commandment I give unto you concerning Zion, that you shall no longer be bound as a united order to your brethren of Zion,

only on this wise—⁴⁸After you are organized, you shall be called the United Order of the Stake of Zion, the City of Kirtland. And your brethren, after they are organized, shall be called the United Order of the City of Zion. ⁴⁹And they shall be organized in their own names, and in their own name; and they shall do their business in their own name, and in their own names; ⁵⁰And you shall do your business in your own name, and in your own names. ⁵¹And this I have commanded to be done for your salvation, and also for their salvation, in consequence of their being driven out and that which is to come. ⁵²The covenants^a being broken through transgression, by covetousness and feigned words—⁵³Therefore, you are dissolved as a united order with your brethren, that you are not bound only up to this hour unto them, only on this wise, as I said,^b by loan as shall be agreed by this order in council, as your circumstances will admit and the voice of the council direct.

⁵⁴And again, a commandment I give unto you concerning your stewardship which I have appointed unto you. ⁵⁵Behold, all these properties are mine, or else your faith is vain, and ye are found hypocrites, and the covenants which ye have made unto me^c are broken; ⁵⁶And if the properties are mine, then ye are stewards; otherwise ye are no stewards. ⁵⁷But, verily I say unto you, I have appointed^d unto you to be stewards over mine house, even stewards indeed. ⁵⁸And for this purpose I have commanded you to organize yourselves, even to print my words,^e the fulness of my scriptures, the revelations which I have given unto you, and which I shall, hereafter, from time to time give unto you— ⁵⁹For the purpose of building up my church and kingdom on the earth, and to prepare my people for the time when I shall dwell with them, which is nigh at hand.

⁶⁰And ye shall prepare for yourselves a place for a treasury, and consecrate it unto my name. ⁶¹And ye shall appoint one among you to keep the treasury, and he shall be ordained unto this blessing. ⁶²And there shall be a seal upon the treasury, and all the sacred things shall be delivered into the treasury; and no man among you shall call it his own, or any part of it, for it shall belong to you all with one accord. ⁶³And I give it unto you from this very hour; and now see to it, that ye go to and make use of the stewardship

which I have appointed unto you, exclusive of the sacred things, for the purpose of printing these sacred things as I have said. ^a ⁶⁴And the avails of the sacred things shall be had in the treasury, and a seal shall be upon it; and it shall not be used or taken out of the treasury by any one, neither shall the seal be loosed which shall be placed upon it, only by the voice of the order, or by commandment. ⁶⁵And thus shall ye preserve the avails of the sacred things in the treasury, for sacred and holy purposes. ⁶⁶And this shall be called the sacred treasury of the Lord; and a seal shall be kept upon it that it may be holy and consecrated unto the Lord.

⁶⁷And again, there shall be another treasury prepared, and a treasurer appointed to keep the treasury, and a seal shall be placed upon it; ⁶⁸And all moneys that you receive in your stewardships, by improving upon the properties which I have appointed unto you, in houses, or in lands, or in cattle, or in all things save it be the holy and sacred writings, which I have reserved unto myself for holy and sacred purposes, shall be cast into the treasury as fast as you receive moneys, by hundreds, or by fifties, or by twenties, or by tens, or by fives. 69Or in other words, if any man among you obtain five dollars let him cast them into the treasury; or if he obtain ten, or twenty, or fifty, or an hundred, let him do likewise; 70And let not any among you say that it is his own; for it shall not be called his, nor any part of it. 71 And there shall not any part of it be used, or taken out of the treasury, only by the voice and common consent of the order. 72 And this shall be the voice and common consent of the order—that any man among you say to the treasurer: I have need of this to help me in my stewardship— 73If it be five dollars, or if it be ten dollars, or twenty, or fifty, or a hundred, the treasurer shall give unto him the sum which he requires to help him in his stewardship—74Until he be found a transgressor, and it is manifest before the council of the order plainly that he is an unfaithful and an unwise steward. 75But so long as he is in full fellowship, and is faithful and wise in his stewardship, this shall be his token unto the treasurer that the treasurer shall not withhold. ⁷⁶But in case of transgression, the treasurer shall be subject unto the council and voice of the order. ⁷⁷And in case the treasurer is found an unfaithful and an unwise steward, he shall be subject to the council and voice of the order, and shall be removed out of his place, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

⁷⁸And again, verily I say unto you, concerning your debts—behold it is my will that you shall pay all your debts. ⁷⁹And it is my will that you shall

humble yourselves before me, and obtain this blessing by your diligence and humility and the prayer of faith. 80 And inasmuch as you are diligent and humble, and exercise the prayer of faith, behold, I will soften the hearts of those to whom you are in debt, until I shall send means unto you for your deliverance. ^a 81 Therefore write speedily to New York and write according to that which shall be dictated by my Spirit; and I will soften the hearts of those to whom you are in debt, that it shall be taken away out of their minds to bring affliction upon you. 82 And inasmuch as ye are humble and faithful and call upon my name, behold, I will give you the victory. 83I give unto you a promise, that you shall be delivered this once out of your bondage. 84Inasmuch as you obtain a chance to loan money by hundreds, or thousands, even until you shall loan enough to deliver yourself from bondage, it is your privilege. 85 And pledge the properties which I have put into your hands, this once, by giving your names by common consent or otherwise, as it shall seem good unto you. 86I give unto you this privilege, this once; and behold, if you proceed to do the things which I have laid before you, according to my commandments, all these things are mine, and ye are my stewards, and the master will not suffer his house to be broken up.

²Behold, I say unto you, were it not for the transgressions of my people, speaking concerning the church and not individuals, they might have been redeemed even now. ³But behold, they have not learned to be obedient to the things which I required at their hands, ^c but are full of all manner of evil, and do not impart of their substance, ^d as becometh saints, to the poor and afflicted among them; ⁴And are not united according to the union required by the law of the celestial kingdom; ⁵And Zion cannot be built up unless it is by the principles of the law of the celestial kingdom;

otherwise I cannot receive her unto myself. ⁶And my people must needs be chastened until they learn obedience, if it must needs be, by the things which they suffer.

⁷I speak not concerning those who are appointed to lead my people, who are the first elders of my church, a for they are not all under this condemnation; ⁸But I speak concerning my churches abroad—there are many who will say: Where is their God? Behold, he will deliver them in time of trouble, otherwise we will not go up unto Zion, and will keep our moneys.

⁹Therefore, in consequence of the transgressions of my people, it is expedient in me that mine elders should wait for a little season for the redemption of Zion— 10 That they themselves may be prepared, and that my people may be taught more perfectly, and have experience, and know more perfectly concerning their duty, and the things which I require at their hands. ¹¹And this cannot be brought to pass until mine elders are endowed with power from on high.^b 12For behold, I have prepared a great endowment and blessing to be poured out upon them, inasmuch as they are faithful and continue in humility before me.

¹³Therefore it is expedient in me that mine elders should wait for a little season, for the redemption of Zion. 14For behold, I do not require at their hands to fight the battles of Zion; for, as I said in a former commandment,^d even so will I fulfil—I will fight your battles. ¹⁶Behold, the destroyer I have sent forth to destroy and lay waste mine enemies; and not many years hence they shall not be left to pollute mine heritage, and to blaspheme my name upon the lands which I have consecrated for the gathering together of my saints.

¹⁶Behold, I have commanded^g my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., to say unto the strength of my house, even my warriors, my young men, and middle-aged, to gather together for the redemption of my people, and throw down the towers of mine enemies, and scatter their watchmen; ¹⁷But the strength of mine house have not hearkened unto my words. ¹⁸But inasmuch

as there are those who have hearkened unto my words, I have prepared a blessing and an endowment for them,^a if they continue faithful. ¹⁹I have heard their prayers, and will accept their offering; and it is expedient in me that they should be brought thus far for a trial of their faith.

New commandments on Zion's redemption

²⁰And now, verily I say unto you, a commandment I give unto you, that as many as have come up hither, that can stay in the region round about, let them stay; ²¹And those that cannot stay, who have families in the east, let them tarry for a little season, inasmuch as my servant Joseph shall appoint unto them; ²²For I will counsel him concerning this matter, and all things whatsoever he shall appoint unto them shall be fulfilled.

²³And let all my people who dwell in the regions round about be very faithful, and prayerful, and humble before me, and reveal not the things which I have revealed unto them,^b until it is wisdom in me that they should be revealed. ²⁴Talk not of judgments, neither boast of faith nor of mighty works, but carefully gather together, as much in one region as can be, consistently with the feelings of the people; ²⁵And behold, I will give unto you favor and grace in their eyes, that you may rest in peace and safety, while you are saying unto the people: Execute judgment and justice for us according to law, and redress us of our wrongs.

²⁶Now, behold, I say unto you, my friends, in this way you may find favor in the eyes of the people, until the army of Israel becomes very great. ²⁷And I will soften the hearts of the people, as I did the heart of Pharaoh, ^c from time to time, until my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., and mine elders, whom I have appointed, ^d shall have time to gather up the strength of my house, ²⁸And to have sent wise men, to fulfil that which I have commanded concerning the purchasing of all the lands in Jackson county that can be purchased, and in the adjoining counties round about. ²⁹For it is my will that these lands should be purchased; and after they are purchased that my saints should possess them according to the laws of consecration which I have given.^f

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³⁰And after these lands are purchased, I will hold the armies of Israel guiltless in taking possession of their own lands, which they have previously purchased with their moneys, and of throwing down the towers of mine enemies that may be upon them, and scattering their watchmen, and avenging me of mine enemies unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me. ³¹But first let my army become very great, and let it be sanctified before me, that it may become fair as the sun, and clear as the moon, and that her banners may be terrible unto all nations; ^b ³²That the kingdoms of this world may be constrained to acknowledge that the kingdom of Zion is in very deed the kingdom of our God and his Christ; ^c therefore, let us become subject unto her laws.

Closing

³³Verily I say unto you, it is expedient in me that the first elders of my church should receive their endowment from on high in my house,^d which I have commanded to be built unto my name in the land of Kirtland.^e ³⁴And let those commandments which I have given concerning Zion and her law^f be executed and fulfilled, after her redemption.

³⁶There has been a day of calling, but the time has come for a day of choosing;⁸ and let those be chosen that are worthy. ³⁶And it shall be manifest unto my servant, by the voice of the Spirit, those that are chosen;^h and they shall be sanctified; ³⁷And inasmuch as they follow the counsel which they receive, they shall have power after many days to accomplish all things pertaining to Zion.

³⁸And again I say unto you, sue for peace, not only to the people that have smitten you, but also to all people; ³⁹And lift up an ensign of peace, and make a proclamation of peace unto the ends of the earth; ⁴⁰And make proposals for peace unto those who have smitten you, according to the voice of the Spirit which is in you, and all things shall work together for

⁴And again, verily I say unto you, the coming of the Lord draweth nigh, and it overtaketh the world as a thief in the night— ⁵Therefore, gird up your loins, that you may be the children of light, and that day shall not overtake you as a thief.

⁶And again, verily I say unto you, there was joy in heaven when my servant Warren bowed to my scepter, and separated himself from the crafts of men; ⁷Therefore, blessed is my servant Warren, for I will have mercy on him; and, notwithstanding the vanity of his heart, I will lift him up inasmuch as he will humble himself before me. ⁸And I will give him grace and assurance wherewith he may stand; and if he continue to be a faithful witness and a light unto the church I have prepared a crown for him in the mansions of my Father.

Orders of the priesthood__a
Late April 1835 (vv. 1–58)

[†]There are, in the church, two priesthoods, namely, the Melchizedek and Aaronic, including the Levitical Priesthood.

²Why the first is called the Melchizedek Priesthood is because Melchizedek was such a great high priest.^b ³Before his day it was called *the Holy Priesthood, after the Order of the Son of God.* ⁴But out of respect or reverence to the name of the Supreme Being, to avoid the too frequent repetition of his name, they, the church, in ancient days, called that priesthood after Melchizedek, or the Melchizedek Priesthood. ⁵All other authorities or offices in the church are appendages to this priesthood. ⁶But there are two divisions or grand heads—one is the Melchizedek Priesthood, and the

other is the Aaronic or Levitical Priesthood. ⁷The office of an elder comes under the priesthood of Melchizedek. ⁸The Melchizedek Priesthood holds the right of presidency, and has power and authority over all the offices in the church in all ages of the world, to administer in spiritual things.

⁹The Presidency of the High Priesthood, after the order of Melchizedek, ^a have a right to officiate in all the offices in the church. ¹⁰High priests after the order of the Melchizedek Priesthood have a right to officiate in their own standing, under the direction of the presidency, in administering spiritual things, and also in the office of an elder, priest (of the Levitical order), teacher, deacon, and member. ¹¹An elder has a right to officiate in his stead when the high priest is not present. ¹²The high priest and elder are to administer in spiritual things, agreeable to the covenants and commandments of the church; and they have a right to officiate in all these offices of the church when there are no higher authorities present.

¹³The second priesthood is called the Priesthood of Aaron, because it was conferred upon Aaron and his seed,^b throughout all their generations. ¹⁴Why it is called the lesser priesthood is because it is an appendage to the greater, or the Melchizedek Priesthood, and has power in administering outward ordinances.

¹⁵The bishopric is the presidency of this priesthood, and holds the keys or authority of the same. ¹⁶No man has a legal right to this office, to hold the keys of this priesthood, except he be a literal descendant of Aaron. ^c ¹⁷But as a high priest of the Melchizedek Priesthood has authority to

officiate in all the lesser offices, he may officiate in the office of bishop when no literal descendant of Aaron can be found, provided he is called and set apart and ordained unto this power by the hands of the Presidency of the Melchizedek Priesthood.

¹⁸The power and authority of the higher, or Melchizedek Priesthood, is to hold the keys of all the spiritual blessings of the church— ¹⁹To have the privilege of receiving the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, to have the heavens opened unto them, to commune with the general assembly and church of the Firstborn, and to enjoy the communion and presence of God the Father, and Jesus the mediator of the new covenant.

²⁰The power and authority of the lesser, or Aaronic Priesthood, is to hold the keys of the ministering of angels, and to administer in outward ordinances, the letter of the gospel, the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins, agreeable to the covenants and commandments.

Presiding officers

²¹Of necessity there are presidents, or presiding officers growing out of, or appointed of or from among those who are ordained to the several offices in these two priesthoods.

- ²²Of the Melchizedek Priesthood, three Presiding High Priests, chosen by the body, appointed and ordained to that office, and upheld by the confidence, faith, and prayer of the church, form a quorum of the Presidency of the Church.
- ²³The twelve traveling councilors are called to be the Twelve Apostles, or special witnesses of the name of Christ in all the world—thus differing from other officers in the church in the duties of their calling. ²⁴And they form a quorum, equal in authority and power to the three presidents previously mentioned.
- ²⁵The Seventy^a are also called to preach the gospel, and to be especial witnesses unto the Gentiles and in all the world—thus differing from other officers in the church in the duties of their calling. ²⁶And they form a quorum, equal in authority to that of the Twelve special witnesses or Apostles just named.

²⁷And every decision made by either of these quorums must be by the unanimous voice of the same; that is, every member in each quorum must be agreed to its decisions, in order to make their decisions of the same power or validity one with the other— ²⁸A majority may form a quorum

when circumstances render it impossible to be otherwise— ²⁹Unless this is the case, their decisions are not entitled to the same blessings which the decisions of a quorum of three presidents were anciently, who were ordained after the order of Melchizedek, and were righteous and holy men.

³⁰The decisions of these quorums, or either of them, are to be made in all righteousness, in holiness, and lowliness of heart, meekness and long suffering, and in faith, and virtue, and knowledge, temperance, patience, godliness, brotherly kindness and charity; ³¹Because the promise^a is, if these things abound in them they shall not be unfruitful in the knowledge of the Lord. ³²And in case that any decision of these quorums is made in unrighteousness, it may be brought before a general assembly of the several quorums, which constitute the spiritual authorities of the church; otherwise there can be no appeal from their decision.

³³The Twelve are a Traveling Presiding High Council, to officiate in the name of the Lord, under the direction of the Presidency of the Church, agreeable to the institution of heaven; to build up the church, and regulate all the affairs of the same in all nations, first unto the Gentiles and secondly unto the Jews.

³⁴The Seventy are to act in the name of the Lord, under the direction of the Twelve or the traveling high council, in building up the church and regulating all the affairs of the same in all nations, first unto the Gentiles and then to the Jews; ³⁵The Twelve being sent out, holding the keys, to open the door by the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ, and first unto the Gentiles and then unto the Jews.

³⁶The standing high councils, at the stakes of Zion,^b form a quorum equal in authority in the affairs of the church, in all their decisions, to the quorum of the presidency, or to the traveling high council. ³⁷The high council in Zion form a quorum equal in authority in the affairs of the church, in all their decisions, to the councils of the Twelve at the stakes of Zion.

Duties of the twelve apostles

³⁸It is the duty of the traveling high council to call upon the Seventy, when they need assistance, to fill the several calls for preaching and administering the gospel, instead of any others.

³⁹It is the duty of the Twelve, in all large branches of the church, to ordain evangelical ministers,^a as they shall be designated unto them by revelation—

⁴⁰The order of this priesthood was confirmed to be handed down from father to son, and rightly belongs to the literal descendants of the chosen seed, to whom the promises were made. ^b ⁴¹This order was instituted in the days of Adam, and came down by lineage in the following manner: ^c

- ⁴²From Adam to Seth, who was ordained by Adam at the age of sixtynine years, and was blessed by him three years previous to his (Adam's) death, and received the promise of God by his father, that his posterity should be the chosen of the Lord, and that they should be preserved unto the end of the earth; ⁴³Because he (Seth) was a perfect man, and his likeness was the express likeness of his father, ^d insomuch that he seemed to be like unto his father in all things, and could be distinguished from him only by his age.
- ⁴⁴Enos was ordained at the age of one hundred and thirty-four years and four months, by the hand of Adam.
- ⁴⁵God called upon Cainan in the wilderness in the fortieth year of his age; and he met Adam in journeying to the place Shedolamak. He was eighty-seven years old when he received his ordination.
- ⁴⁶Mahalaleel was four hundred and ninety-six years and seven days old when he was ordained by the hand of Adam, who also blessed him.

⁵³Three years previous to the death of Adam, he called Seth, Enos, Cainan, Mahalaleel, Jared, Enoch, and Methuselah, who were all high priests, with the residue of his posterity who were righteous, into the valley of Adam-ondi-Ahman, and there bestowed upon them his last blessing. ⁵⁴And the Lord appeared unto them, and they rose up and blessed Adam, and called him Michael, the prince, the archangel. ⁵⁵And the Lord administered comfort unto Adam, and said unto him: I have set thee to be at the head; a multitude of nations shall come of thee, and thou art a prince over them forever. ^a ⁵⁶And Adam stood up in the midst of the congregation; and, notwithstanding he was bowed down with age, being full of the Holy Ghost, predicted whatsoever should befall his posterity unto the latest generation. ⁵⁷These things were all written in the book of Enoch, and are to be testified of in due time.

60 Verily, I say unto you, saith the Lord of Hosts, there must needs be

- presiding elders to preside over those who are of the office of an elder;
- 61 And also priests to preside over those who are of the office of a priest;
- ⁶²And also teachers to preside over those who are of the office of a teacher, in like manner,
- and also the deacons—

⁶³Wherefore, from deacon to teacher, and from teacher to priest, and from priest to elder, severally as they are appointed, according to the covenants and commandments of the church.

President of the high priesthood

⁶⁴Then comes the High Priesthood, which is the greatest of all. ⁶⁵Wherefore, it must needs be that one be appointed of the High Priesthood to preside over the priesthood, and he shall be called President of the High Priesthood of the Church; ⁶⁶Or, in other words, the Presiding High Priest over the High Priesthood of the Church. ⁶⁷From the same comes the administering of ordinances and blessings upon the church, by the laying on of the hands.

President of the Aaronic priesthood

⁶⁸Wherefore, the office of a bishop is not equal unto it; for the office of a bishop is in administering all temporal things; ⁶⁹Nevertheless a bishop must be chosen from the High Priesthood, unless he is a literal descendant of Aaron; ⁷⁰For unless he is a literal descendant of Aaron he cannot hold the keys of that priesthood.

⁷¹Nevertheless, a high priest, that is, after the order of Melchizedek, may be set apart unto the ministering of temporal things, having a knowledge of them by the Spirit of truth; ⁷²And also to be a judge in Israel, to do the business of the church, to sit in judgment upon transgressors upon testimony as it shall be laid before him according to the laws, by the assistance of his counselors, whom he has chosen or will choose among the elders of the church. ⁷³This is the duty of a bishop who is not a literal descendant of Aaron, but has been ordained to the High Priesthood after the order of Melchizedek. ⁷⁴Thus shall he be a judge, even a common judge among the inhabitants of Zion, or in a stake of Zion, or in any branch of the church where he shall be set apart unto this ministry, until the borders of Zion are enlarged and it becomes necessary to have other bishops or judges in Zion

or elsewhere.^a ⁷⁵And inasmuch as there are other bishops appointed they shall act in the same office.

⁷⁶But a literal descendant of Aaron has a legal right to the presidency of this priesthood, to the keys of this ministry, to act in the office of bishop independently, without counselors, except in a case where a President of the High Priesthood, after the order of Melchizedek, is tried, to sit as a judge in Israel.

⁷⁸Again, verily, I say unto you, the most important business of the church, and the most difficult cases of the church, inasmuch as there is not satisfaction upon the decision of the bishop or judges, it shall be handed over and carried up unto the council of the church, before the Presidency of the High Priesthood. ⁷⁹And the Presidency of the council of the High Priesthood shall have power to call other high priests, even twelve, to assist as counselors; and thus the Presidency of the High Priesthood and its counselors shall have power to decide upon testimony according to the laws of the church. ⁸⁰And after this decision it shall be had in remembrance no more before the Lord; for this is the highest council of the church of God, and a final decision upon controversies in spiritual matters. ⁸⁷There is not any person belonging to the church who is exempt from this council of the church.

⁹³And it is according to the vision showing the order of the Seventy,^b that they should have seven presidents to preside over them, chosen out of the number of the seventy;^c ⁹⁴And the seventh president of these presidents is to preside over the six; ⁹⁵And these seven presidents are to choose other seventy besides the first seventy to whom they belong, and are to preside over them; ⁹⁶And also other seventy, until seven times seventy, if the labor in the vineyard of necessity requires it. ⁹⁷And these seventy are to be traveling ministers, unto the Gentiles first and also unto the Jews.^d ⁹⁸Whereas other officers of the church, who belong not unto the Twelve, neither to the Seventy, are not under the responsibility to travel among all nations, but are to travel as their circumstances shall allow, notwithstanding they may hold as high and responsible offices in the church.





Tt is an imperative duty that we owe to God, to angels, with whom we shall be brought to stand, and also to ourselves, to our wives and children, who have been made to bow down with grief, sorrow, and care, under the most damning hand of murder, tyranny, and oppression, supported and urged on and upheld by the influence of that spirit which hath so strongly riveted the creeds of the fathers, who have inherited lies, upon the hearts of the children, and filled the world with confusion, and has been growing stronger and stronger, and is now the very mainspring of all corruption, and the whole earth groans under the weight of its iniquity. ⁸It is an iron yoke, it is a strong band; they are the very handcuffs, and chains, and shackles, and fetters of hell.



PART 4: ILLINOIS

Sections 124–135 April 1839–February 1846

With the prophet free again, the saints had a fresh start building a new community in Illinois. They built a new city and temple and organized the women into the Relief Society. The Lord gave revelations regarding salvation for the dead, eternal families, and plural marriage. Eventually enemies were successful in capturing and killing the prophet Joseph Smith, and in driving the Saints from the state.

Verily, thus saith the Lord unto you, my servant Joseph Smith, I am well pleased with your offering and acknowledgments, which you have made; for unto this end have I raised you up, that I might show forth my wisdom through the weak things of the earth.


Proclamation to all the kings of the world

²Your prayers are acceptable before me; and in answer to them I say unto you, that you are now called immediately to make a solemn proclamation of my gospel,^a and of this stake which I have planted to be a cornerstone of Zion, which shall be polished with the refinement which is after the similitude of a palace. ³This proclamation shall be made to all the kings of the world,^b to the four corners thereof, to the honorable president-elect, and the high-minded governors of the nation in which you live, and to all the nations of the earth scattered abroad. ⁴Let it be written in the spirit of

meekness and by the power of the Holy Ghost, which shall be in you at the time of the writing of the same; ⁵For it shall be given you by the Holy Ghost to know my will concerning those kings and authorities, even what shall befall them in a time to come. ⁶For, behold, I am about to call upon them to give heed to the light and glory of Zion, for the set time has come to favor her.

⁷Call ye, therefore, upon them with loud proclamation, and with your testimony, fearing them not, for they are as grass, and all their glory as the flower thereof which soon falleth, that they may be left also without excuse^a— ⁸And that I may visit them in the day of visitation, when I shall unveil the face of my covering, to appoint the portion of the oppressor among hypocrites, where there is gnashing of teeth, if they reject my servants and my testimony which I have revealed unto them. ⁹And again, I will visit and soften their hearts, many of them for your good, that ye may find grace in their eyes, that they may come to the light of truth, and the Gentiles to the exaltation or lifting up of Zion. ¹⁰For the day of my visitation cometh speedily, in an hour when ye think not of; and where shall be the safety of my people, and refuge for those who shall be left of them? ¹¹Awake, O kings of the earth! Come ye, O, come ye, with your gold and your silver, to the help of my people, to the house of the daughters of Zion.

¹²And again, verily I say unto you, let my servant Robert B. Thompson help you to write this proclamation, ^b for I am well pleased with him, and that he should be with you; ¹³Let him, therefore, hearken to your counsel, and I will bless him with a multiplicity of blessings; let him be faithful and

true in all things from henceforth, and he shall be great in mine eyes; ¹⁴But let him remember that his stewardship will I require at his hands.

¹⁵And again, verily I say unto you, blessed is my servant Hyrum Smith; for I, the Lord, love him because of the integrity of his heart, and because he loveth that which is right before me, saith the Lord.

¹⁶Again, let my servant John C. Bennett help you in your labor in sending my word to the kings and people of the earth, and stand by you, even you my servant Joseph Smith, in the hour of affliction; and his reward shall not fail if he receive counsel. ¹⁷And for his love he shall be great, for he shall be mine if he do this, saith the Lord. I have seen the work which he hath done, which I accept if he continue, and will crown him with blessings and great glory.

¹⁸And again, I say unto you that it is my will that my servant Lyman Wight should continue in preaching for Zion, in the spirit of meekness, confessing me before the world; and I will bear him up as on eagles' wings; and he shall beget glory and honor to himself and unto my name. ¹⁹That when he shall finish his work I may receive him unto myself, even as I did my servant David Patten, who is with me at this time, ^a and also my servant Edward Partridge, ^b and also my aged servant Joseph Smith, Sen., ^c who sitteth with Abraham at his right hand, and blessed and holy is he, for he is mine.

²⁰And again, verily I say unto you, my servant George Miller is without guile; he may be trusted because of the integrity of his heart; and for the love which he has to my testimony I, the Lord, love him. ²¹I therefore say unto you, I seal upon his head the office of a bishopric, like unto my servant Edward Partridge,^d that he may receive the consecrations of mine house, that he may administer blessings upon the heads of the poor of my people, saith the Lord. Let no man despise my servant George, for he shall honor me.

²²Let my servant George, and my servant Lyman, and my servant John Snider, and others, build a house unto my name, ^e such a one as my servant

Joseph shall show unto them, upon the place which he shall show unto them also.^a ²³And it shall be for a house for boarding, a house that strangers may come from afar to lodge therein; therefore let it be a good house, worthy of all acceptation, that the weary traveler may find health and safety while he shall contemplate the word of the Lord; and the corner-stone I have appointed for Zion.^b ²⁴This house shall be a healthful habitation if it be built unto my name, and if the governor which shall be appointed unto it shall not suffer any pollution to come upon it. It shall be holy, or the Lord your God will not dwell therein.^c

Build a house to my name

²⁶And again, verily I say unto you, let all my saints come from afar. ²⁶And send ye swift messengers, yea, chosen messengers, and say unto them: Come ye, with all your gold, and your silver, and your precious stones, and with all your antiquities; and with all who have knowledge of antiquities, that will come, may come, and bring the box-tree, and the fir-tree, and the pine-tree, together with all the precious trees of the earth; ²⁷And with iron, with copper, and with brass, and with zinc, and with all your precious things of the earth; and build a house to my name, for the Most High to dwell therein.

²⁸For there is not a place found on earth that he may come to and restore again that which was lost unto you, or which he hath taken away,^d even the fulness of the priesthood. ²⁹For a baptismal font there is not upon the earth, that they, my saints, may be baptized for those who are dead^e— ³⁰For this ordinance belongeth to my house, and cannot be acceptable to me, only in the days of your poverty, wherein ye are not able to build a house unto me. ³¹But I command you, all ye my saints, to build a house unto me; and I grant unto you a sufficient time to build a house unto me; and during this time your baptisms shall be acceptable unto me. ³²But behold, at the end of this appointment your baptisms for your dead shall not be acceptable unto me; and if you do not these things at the end of the appointment ye shall be rejected as a church, with your dead, saith the Lord your God.

³³For verily I say unto you, that after you have had sufficient time to build a house to me, wherein the ordinance of baptizing for the dead belongeth, and for which the same was instituted from before the foundation of the world, your baptisms for your dead cannot be acceptable unto me; ³⁴For therein are the keys of the holy priesthood ordained, that you may receive honor and glory. ³⁵And after this time, your baptisms for the dead, by those who are scattered abroad, are not acceptable unto me, saith the Lord. ³⁶For it is ordained that in Zion, and in her stakes, and in Jerusalem, those places which I have appointed for refuge, shall be the places for your baptisms for your dead.

⁴⁵And if my people will hearken unto my voice, and unto the voice of my servants whom I have appointed to lead my people, ⁴⁶ behold, verily I say unto you, they shall not be moved out of their place. ⁴⁶ But if they will not hearken to my voice, nor unto the voice of these men whom I have appointed, they shall not be blest, because they pollute mine holy grounds, and mine holy ordinances, and charters, and my holy words which I give unto them. ⁴⁷ And it shall come to pass that if you build a house unto my name, and do not do the things that I say, I will not perform the oath which I make unto you, ^b neither fulfil the promises which ye expect at my hands, saith the Lord. ⁴⁸ For instead of blessings, ye, by your own works, bring cursings, wrath, indignation, and judgments upon your own heads, by your follies, and by all your abominations, which you practise before me, saith the Lord.

⁴⁹Verily, verily, I say unto you, that when I give a commandment to any of the sons of men to do a work unto my name, and those sons of men go with all their might and with all they have to perform that work, and cease not their diligence, and their enemies come upon them and hinder them from performing that work, behold, it behooveth me to require that work no more at the hands of those sons of men, but to accept of their offerings. 50 And the iniquity and transgression of my holy laws and commandments I will visit upon the heads of those who hindered my work, unto the third and fourth generation, so long as they repent not, and hate me, saith the Lord God. ⁵¹Therefore, for this cause have I accepted the offerings of those whom I commanded to build up a city and a house unto my name, in Jackson county, Missouri,^c and were hindered by their enemies, saith the Lord your God. 52 And I will answer judgment, wrath, and indignation, wailing, and anguish, and gnashing of teeth upon their heads, unto the third and fourth generation, so long as they repent not, and hate me, saith the Lord your God.

⁵³And this I make an example unto you, for your consolation concerning all those who have been commanded to do a work and have been hindered by the hands of their enemies, and by oppression, saith the Lord your God. ⁵⁴For I am the Lord your God, and will save all those of your

⁵⁵And again, verily I say unto you, I command you again to build a house to my name, even in this place, that you may prove yourselves unto me that ye are faithful in all things whatsoever I command you, that I may bless you, and crown you with honor, immortality, and eternal life.

⁵⁶And now I say unto you, as pertaining to my boarding house which I have commanded you to build for the boarding of strangers,^a let it be built unto my name, and let my name be named upon it, and let my servant Joseph and his house have place therein, from generation to generation. ⁵⁷For this anointing have I put upon his head,^b that his blessing shall also be put upon the head of his posterity after him. ⁵⁸And as I said unto Abraham concerning the kindreds of the earth,^c even so I say unto my servant Joseph: In thee and in thy seed shall the kindred of the earth be blessed. ⁵⁹Therefore, let my servant Joseph and his seed after him have place in that house, from generation to generation, forever and ever, saith the Lord. ⁶⁰And let the name of that house be called Nauvoo House;^d and let it be a delightful habitation for man, and a resting-place for the weary traveler, that he may contemplate the glory of Zion, and the glory of this, the corner-stone thereof;^e ⁶⁷That he may receive also the counsel from those whom I have set to be as plants of renown, and as watchmen upon her walls.

⁶²Behold, verily I say unto you, let my servant George Miller, and my servant Lyman Wight, and my servant John Snider, and my servant Peter Haws, organize themselves, and appoint one of them to be a president over their quorum^f for the purpose of building that house. ⁶³And they shall form a constitution, whereby they may receive stock for the building of that house. ⁶⁴And they shall not receive less than fifty dollars for a share of stock in that house, and they shall be permitted to receive fifteen thousand dollars from any one man for stock in that house. ⁶⁵But they shall not be

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permitted to receive over fifteen thousand dollars stock from any one man. ⁶⁶And they shall not be permitted to receive under fifty dollars for a share of stock from any one man in that house. ⁶⁷And they shall not be permitted to receive any man, as a stockholder in this house, except the same shall pay his stock into their hands at the time he receives stock; ⁶⁸And in proportion to the amount of stock he pays into their hands he shall receive stock in that house; but if he pays nothing into their hands he shall not receive any stock in that house. ⁶⁹And if any pay stock into their hands it shall be for stock in that house, for himself, and for his generation after him, from generation to generation, so long as he and his heirs shall hold that stock, and do not sell or convey the stock away out of their hands by their own free will and act, if you will do my will, saith the Lord your God.

⁷⁰And again, verily I say unto you, if my servant George Miller, and my servant Lyman Wight, and my servant John Snider, and my servant Peter Haws, receive any stock into their hands, in moneys, or in properties wherein they receive the real value of moneys, they shall not appropriate any portion of that stock to any other purpose, only in that house. ⁷¹And if they do appropriate any portion of that stock anywhere else, only in that house, without the consent of the stockholder, and do not repay fourfold for the stock which they appropriate anywhere else, only in that house, they shall be accursed, and shall be moved out of their place, saith the Lord God; for I, the Lord, am God, and cannot be mocked in any of these things.

⁷²Verily I say unto you, let my servant Joseph pay stock into their hands for the building of that house, as seemeth him good; but my servant Joseph cannot pay over fifteen thousand dollars stock in that house, nor under fifty dollars; neither can any other man, saith the Lord.

⁷³And there are others also who wish to know my will concerning them, for they have asked it at my hands.

Forasmuch as the Lord has revealed unto me that my enemies, both in Missouri and this State, were again^c in the pursuit of me; and inasmuch as they pursue me without a cause, and have not the least shadow or coloring of justice or right on their side in the getting up of their prosecutions against me; and inasmuch as their pretensions are all founded in falsehood of the blackest dye, I have thought it expedient and wisdom in me to leave the place for a short season,^d for my own safety and the safety of this people. I would say to all those with whom I have business,^e that I have left my affairs with agents and clerks who will transact all business in a prompt and proper manner, and will see that all my debts^f are canceled in due time, by turning out property, or otherwise, as the case may require, or as the circumstances may admit of. When I learn that the storm is fully blown over, then I will return to you again.

mon lot all the days of my life;^a and for what cause it seems mysterious, unless I was ordained from before the foundation of the world^b for some good end, or bad, as you may choose to call it. Judge ye for yourselves. God knoweth all these things, whether it be good or bad. But nevertheless, deep water is what I am wont to swim in. It all has become a second nature to me; and I feel, like Paul,^c to glory in tribulation; for to this day has the God of my fathers delivered me out of them all, and will deliver me from henceforth; for behold, and lo, I shall triumph over all my enemies, for the Lord God hath spoken it.^d Let all the saints rejoice, therefore, and be exceedingly glad; for Israel's God is their God, and he will mete out a just recompense of reward upon the heads of all their oppressors.

BAPTISM FOR THE DEAD

6 September 1842 ≈ Nauvoo, Illinois

¹As I stated to you in my letter^e before I left my place, that I would write to you from time to time and give you information in relation to many subjects, I now resume the subject of the baptism for the dead, as that subject seems to occupy my mind, and press itself upon my feelings the strongest, since I have been pursued by my enemies.^{f 2}I wrote a few words of revelation to you concerning a recorder.^g I have had a few additional views in relation to this matter, which I now certify.

That is, it was declared in my former letter that there should be a recorder, who should be eye-witness, and also to hear with his ears, that he might make a record of a truth before the Lord. ³Now, in relation to this matter, it would be very difficult for one recorder to be present at all times, and to do all the business. To obviate this difficulty, there can be a recorder

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appointed in each ward of the city, who is well qualified for taking accurate minutes; and let him be very particular and precise in taking the whole proceedings, certifying in his record that he saw with his eyes, and heard with his ears, giving the date, and names, and so forth, and the history of the whole transaction; naming also some three individuals that are present, if there be any present, who can at any time when called upon certify to the same, that in the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.

⁴Then, let there be a general recorder, to whom these other records can be handed, being attended with certificates over their own signatures, certifying that the record they have made is true. Then the general church recorder can enter the record on the general church book, with the certificates and all the attending witnesses, with his own statement that he verily believes the above statement and records to be true, from his knowledge of the general character and appointment of those men by the church. And when this is done on the general church book, the record shall be just as holy, and shall answer the ordinance just the same as if he had seen with his eyes and heard with his ears, and made a record of the same on the general church book.⁴

Scriptural precedents

⁵You may think this order of things to be very particular; but let me tell you that it is only to answer the will of God, by conforming to the ordinance and preparation that the Lord ordained and prepared before the foundation of the world, for the salvation of the dead who should die without a knowledge of the gospel.^b

Keys to record in heaven_

⁶And further, I want you to remember that John the Revelator was contemplating this very subject in relation to the dead, when he declared, as you will find recorded in Revelation 20:12^c—

And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened; and another book was opened, which is the book of life; and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works.

You will discover in this quotation that the books were opened; and another book was opened, which was the book of life; but the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works; consequently, the books spoken of must be the books which contained the record of their works, and refer to the records which are kept on the earth. And the book which was the book of life is the record which is kept in heaven; the principle agreeing precisely with the doctrine which is commanded you in the revelation contained in the letter which I wrote to you previous to my leaving my place—that in all your recordings it may be recorded in heaven.

[®]Now, the nature of this ordinance consists in the power of the priesthood, by the revelation of Jesus Christ, wherein it is granted that whatsoever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatsoever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. [®] Or, in other words, taking a different view of the translation, whatsoever you record on earth shall be recorded in heaven, and whatsoever you do not record on earth shall not be recorded in heaven; for out of the books shall your dead be judged, according to their own works, whether they themselves have attended to the ordinances in their own *propria persona*, or by the means of their own agents, according to the ordinance which God has prepared for their salvation from before the foundation of the world, according to the records which they have kept concerning their dead.

⁹It may seem to some to be a very bold doctrine that we talk of—a power which records or binds on earth and binds in heaven. Nevertheless, in all ages of the world, whenever the Lord has given a dispensation of the priesthood to any man by actual revelation, or any set of men, this power has always been given.^c Hence, whatsoever those men did in authority, in the name of the Lord, and did it truly and faithfully, and kept a proper and faithful record of the same, it became a law on earth and in heaven, and could not be annulled, according to the decrees of the great Jehovah. This is a faithful saying. Who can hear it?

it. And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

"Now the great and grand secret of the whole matter, and the *summum* bonum of the whole subject that is lying before us, consists in obtaining the powers of the Holy Priesthood. For him to whom these keys are given there is no difficulty in obtaining a knowledge of facts in relation to the salvation of the children of men, both as well for the dead as for the living.

¹²Herein is glory and honor, and immortality and eternal life—The ordinance of baptism by water, to be immersed therein in order to answer to the likeness of the dead, that one principle might accord with the other; to be immersed in the water and come forth out of the water is in the likeness of the resurrection of the dead in coming forth out of their graves; hence, this ordinance was instituted to form a relationship with the ordinance of baptism for the dead, being in likeness of the dead. ¹³Consequently, the baptismal font was instituted as a similitude of the grave, and was commanded to be in a place underneath where the living are wont to assemble, to show forth the living and the dead, and that all things may have their likeness, and that they may accord one with another—that which is earthly conforming to that which is heavenly, as Paul hath declared, 1 Corinthians 15:46, 47, and 48:

¹⁴Howbeit that was not first which is spiritual, but that which is natural; and afterward that which is spiritual. The first man is of the earth, earthy; the second man is the Lord from heaven. As is the earthy, such are they also that are earthy; and as is the heavenly, such are they also that are heavenly.

And as are the records on the earth in relation to your dead, which are truly made out, so also are the records in heaven. This, therefore, is the sealing and binding power, and, in one sense of the word, the keys of the kingdom, which consist in the key of knowledge.

__Salvation for the living depends on the dead__The dead being made perfect

¹⁵And now, my dearly beloved brethren and sisters, let me assure you that these are principles in relation to the dead and the living that cannot be

lightly passed over, as pertaining to our salvation. For their salvation is necessary and essential to our salvation, as Paul says concerning the fathers^a—

that they without us cannot be made perfect

—neither can we without our dead be made perfect.

 16 And now, in relation to the baptism for the dead, I will give you another quotation of Paul, 1 Corinthians 15:29:

Else what shall they do which are baptized for the dead, if the dead rise not at all? Why are they then baptized for the dead?

¹⁷And again, in connection with this quotation I will give you a quotation from one of the prophets, who had his eye fixed on the restoration of the priesthood,^b the glories to be revealed in the last days,^c and in an especial manner this most glorious of all subjects belonging to the everlasting gospel, namely, the baptism for the dead; for Malachi says, last chapter, verses 5th and 6th:^d

Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord: And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse.

¹⁸I might have rendered a plainer translation to this, but it is sufficiently plain to suit my purpose as it stands. It is sufficient to know, in this case, that the earth will be smitten with a curse unless there is a welding link of some kind or other between the fathers and the children, upon some subject or other—and behold what is that subject?

It is the baptism for the dead. For we without them cannot be made perfect; neither can they without us be made perfect. Neither can they nor we be made perfect without those who have died in the gospel also; for it is necessary in the ushering in of the dispensation of the fulness of times, which dispensation is now beginning to usher in, that a whole and complete and perfect union, and welding together of dispensations, and keys, and powers, and glories should take place, and be revealed from the days of Adam even to the present time. And not only this, but those things

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which never have been revealed from the foundation of the world, but have been kept hid from the wise and prudent, shall be revealed unto babes and sucklings in this, the dispensation of the fulness of times.

Voices from heaven

¹⁹Now, what do we hear in the gospel which we have received?

A voice of gladness! A voice of mercy from heaven; and a voice of truth out of the earth; glad tidings for the dead; a voice of gladness for the living and the dead; glad tidings of great joy.

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of those that bring glad tidings of good things, and that say unto Zion: Behold, thy God reigneth! As the dews of Carmel, so shall the knowledge of God descend upon them!

²⁰And again, what do we hear?

- Glad tidings from Cumorah!^a Moroni, an angel from heaven, declaring the fulfilment of the prophets—the book to be revealed.^b
- A voice of the Lord in the wilderness of Fayette, Seneca county, declaring the three witnesses to bear record of the book!
- The voice of Michael on the banks of the Susquehanna, detecting the devil when he appeared as an angel of light!^d
- The voice of Peter, James, and John in the wilderness between Harmony, Susquehanna county, and Colesville, Broome county, on the Susquehanna river, declaring themselves as possessing the keys of the kingdom, and of the dispensation of the fulness of times!
- ²¹And again, the voice of God in the chamber of old Father Whitmer, in Fayette, Seneca county, and at sundry times, and in divers places through all the travels and tribulations of this Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints!

²²Brethren, shall we not go on in so great a cause? Go forward and not backward. Courage, brethren; and on, on to the victory!

- Let your hearts rejoice, and be exceedingly glad.
- Let the earth break forth into singing.
- Let the dead speak forth anthems of eternal praise to the King Immanuel, who hath ordained, before the world was, that which would enable us to redeem them out of their prison; for the prisoners shall go free.
- ²³Let the mountains shout for joy, and all ye valleys cry aloud; and all ye seas and dry lands tell the wonders of your Eternal King! And ye rivers, and brooks, and rills, flow down with gladness.
- Let the woods and all the trees of the field praise the Lord; and ye solid rocks weep for joy!
- And let the sun, moon, and the morning stars sing together,
- and let all the sons of God shout for joy!
- And let the eternal creations declare his name forever and ever!

And again I say, how glorious is the voice we hear from heaven, proclaiming in our ears, glory, and salvation, and honor, and immortality, and eternal life; kingdoms, principalities, and powers! ²⁴Behold, the great day of the Lord is at hand; and who can abide the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appeareth? For he is like a refiner's fire, and like fuller's soap; and he shall sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto the Lord an offering in righteousness. Let us, therefore, as a church and a people, and as Latter-day Saints, offer unto the Lord an offering in righteousness; and

- ³Secondly: the spirits of just men made perfect, ^c they who are not resurrected, but inherit the same glory.

⁴When a messenger comes saying he has a message from God, offer him your hand and request him to shake hands with you.

- 5If he be an angel he will do so, and you will feel his hand.
- ⁶If he be the spirit of a just man made perfect he will come in his glory; for that is the only way he can appear— ⁷Ask him to shake hands with you, but he will not move, because it is contrary to the order of heaven for a just man to deceive; but he will still deliver his message.

The Father and Son appearing to us

¹When the Savior shall appear we shall see him as he is.^a We shall see that he is a man like ourselves. ²And that same sociality which exists among us here will exist among us there, only it will be coupled with eternal glory, which glory we do not now enjoy.

³John 14:23^b—The appearing of the Father and the Son, in that verse, is a personal appearance; and the idea that the Father and the Son dwell in a man's heart is an old sectarian notion, and is false.

God's time

⁴In answer to the question—Is not the reckoning of God's time, angel's time, prophet's time, and man's time, according to the planet on which they reside?^c

⁵I answer, Yes. But there are no angels who minister to this earth but those who do belong or have belonged to it. ⁶The angels do not reside on a planet like this earth; ⁷But they reside in the presence of God, on a globe like a sea of glass and fire, ^d where all things for their glory are manifest, past, present, and future, and are continually before the Lord. ⁶The place where God resides is a great Urim and Thummim. ^e ⁹This earth, in its sanctified and immortal state, ^f will be made like unto crystal and will be a Urim and Thummim to the inhabitants who dwell thereon, whereby all things pertaining to an inferior kingdom, or all kingdoms of a lower order, will be manifest to those who dwell on it; and this earth will be Christ's.

¹⁰Then the white stone mentioned in Revelation 2:17,^a will become a Urim and Thummim to each individual who receives one, whereby things pertaining to a higher order of kingdoms will be made known; ¹¹And a white stone is given to each of those who come into the celestial kingdom, whereon is a new name written, which no man knoweth save he that receiveth it. The new name is the key word.

The coming of the Son of Man

¹²I prophesy, in the name of the Lord God, that the commencement of the difficulties which will cause much bloodshed previous to the coming of the Son of Man will be in South Carolina. ¹³It may probably arise through the slave question. This a voice declared to me, while I was praying earnestly on the subject, December 25th, 1832.^b

¹⁴I was once praying very earnestly to know the time of the coming of the Son of Man, when I heard a voice repeat the following: ¹⁵Joseph, my son, if thou livest until thou art eighty-five years old, thou shalt see the face of the Son of Man; therefore let this suffice, and trouble me no more on this matter. ¹⁶I was left thus, without being able to decide whether this coming referred to the beginning of the millennium^c or to some previous appearing, or whether I should die and thus see his face. ¹⁷I believe the coming of the Son of Man will not be any sooner than that time.

Obedience ^d

¹⁸Whatever principle of intelligence we attain unto in this life, it will rise with us in the resurrection. ¹⁹And if a person gains more knowledge and intelligence in this life through his diligence and obedience than another, he will have so much the advantage in the world to come.

²⁰There is a law, irrevocably decreed in heaven before the foundations of this world, upon which all blessings are predicated— ²¹And when we obtain any blessing from God, it is by obedience to that law upon which it is predicated.

COVENANT MARRIAGE

12 July 1843 ≤ Nauvoo, Illinois

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Verily, thus saith the Lord unto you my servant Joseph, that inasmuch as you have inquired of my hand to know and understand wherein I, the Lord, justified my servants Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, as also Moses, David and Solomon, my servants, as touching the principle and doctrine of their having many wives and concubines—Behold, and lo, I am the Lord thy God, and will answer thee as touching this matter. Therefore, prepare thy heart to receive and obey the instructions which I am about to give unto you; for all those who have this law revealed unto them must obey the same.

The new and everlasting covenant

⁴For behold, I reveal unto you a new and an everlasting covenant; and if ye abide not that covenant, then are ye damned; for no one can reject this covenant and be permitted to enter into my glory. ⁵For all who will have a blessing at my hands shall abide the law which was appointed for that blessing, and the conditions thereof, as were instituted from before the foundation of the world. ⁶And as pertaining to the new and everlasting covenant, it was instituted for the fulness of my glory; and he that receiveth a fulness thereof must and shall abide the law, or he shall be damned, saith the Lord God. ⁷And verily I say unto you, that the conditions of this law are these:

All covenants, contracts, bonds, obligations, oaths, vows, performances, connections, associations, or expectations, that are not made and entered into and sealed by the Holy Spirit of promise,^g

of him who is anointed, both as well for time and for all eternity, and that too most holy, by revelation and commandment through the medium of mine anointed, whom I have appointed on the earth to hold this power (and I have appointed unto my servant Joseph to hold this power in the last

days, and there is never but one on the earth at a time on whom this power and the keys of this priesthood are conferred,

are of no efficacy, virtue, or force in and after the resurrection from the dead; for all contracts that are not made unto this end have an end when men are dead.

⁸Behold, mine house is a house of order, ^c saith the Lord God, and not a house of confusion.

- Will I accept of an offering, saith the Lord, that is not made in my name?
- 10Or will I receive at your hands that which I have not appointed?
- ¹¹And will I appoint unto you, saith the Lord, except it be by law, even as I and my Father ordained unto you, ^d before the world was?

¹²I am the Lord thy God; and I give unto you this commandment—that no man shall come unto the Father but by me or by my word, which is my law, saith the Lord. ¹³And everything that is in the world, whether it be ordained of men, by thrones, or principalities, or powers, or things of name, whatsoever they may be, that are not by me or by my word, saith the Lord, shall be thrown down, and shall not remain after men are dead, neither in nor after the resurrection, saith the Lord your God. ¹⁴For whatsoever things remain are by me; and whatsoever things are not by me shall be shaken and destroyed.

Case 1: Marrying in the world, not by my word_

¹⁵Therefore, if a man marry him a wife in the world, and he marry her not by me nor by my word, and he covenant with her so long as he is in the world and she with him, their covenant and marriage are not of force when they are dead, and when they are out of the world; therefore, they are not bound by any law when they are out of the world. Therefore, when they are out of the world they neither marry nor are given in marriage; but are appointed angels in heaven, which angels are ministering servants, to minister for those who are worthy of a far more, and an exceeding, and an eternal weight of glory. For these angels did not abide my law; therefore,

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they cannot be enlarged, but remain separately and singly, without exaltation, in their saved condition, to all eternity; and from henceforth are not gods, but are angels of God forever and ever.

Case 2: Marrying for eternity, not by my word_

¹⁸And again, verily I say unto you, if a man marry a wife, and make a covenant with her for time and for all eternity, if that covenant is not by me or by my word, which is my law, and is not sealed by the Holy Spirit of promise, through him whom I have anointed and appointed unto this power,^a then it is not valid neither of force when they are out of the world, because they are not joined by me, saith the Lord, neither by my word; when they are out of the world it cannot be received there, because the angels and the gods are appointed there, by whom they cannot pass;^b they cannot, therefore, inherit my glory; for my house is a house of order,^c saith the Lord God.

Case 3: Marrying by my word

¹⁹And again, verily I say unto you, if a man marry a wife by my word, which is my law, and by the new and everlasting covenant, and it is sealed unto them by the Holy Spirit of promise, by him who is anointed, unto whom I have appointed this power and the keys of this priesthood;^d and it shall be said unto them—Ye shall come forth in the first resurrection; and if it be after the first resurrection, in the next resurrection; and shall inherit thrones, kingdoms, principalities, and powers, dominions, all heights and depths—then shall it be written in the Lamb's Book of Life, that he shall commit no murder whereby to shed innocent blood, and if ye abide in my covenant, and commit no murder whereby to shed innocent blood, it shall be done unto them in all things whatsoever my servant hath put upon them, in time, and through all eternity; and shall be of full force when they are out of the world; and they shall pass by the angels, and the gods, which are set there, to their exaltation and glory in all things, as hath been sealed upon their heads, which glory shall be a fulness and a continuation of the seeds forever and ever. 20 Then shall they be gods, because they have no end; therefore shall they be from everlasting to everlasting, because they

continue; then shall they be above all, because all things are subject unto them. Then shall they be gods, because they have all power, and the angels are subject unto them.

Abiding this law

^{2†}Verily, verily, I say unto you, except ye abide my law ye cannot attain to this glory. ²²For strait is the gate, and narrow the way that leadeth unto the exaltation and continuation of the lives, and few there be that find it, because ye receive me not in the world neither do ye know me. ²³But if ye receive me in the world, then shall ye know me, and shall receive your exaltation; that where I am ye shall be also. ²⁴This is eternal lives—to know the only wise and true God, and Jesus Christ, whom he hath sent. I am he. Receive ye, therefore, my law. ²⁵Broad is the gate, and wide the way that leadeth to the deaths; and many there are that go in thereat, because they receive me not, neither do they abide in my law.

²⁶Verily, verily, I say unto you, if a man marry a wife according to my word, and they are sealed by the Holy Spirit of promise, according to mine appointment, and he or she shall commit any sin or transgression of the new and everlasting covenant whatever, and all manner of blasphemies, and if they commit no murder wherein they shed innocent blood, yet they shall come forth in the first resurrection,^a and enter into their exaltation; but they shall be destroyed in the flesh, and shall be delivered unto the buffetings of Satan unto the day of redemption,^b saith the Lord God. ²⁷The blasphemy against the Holy Ghost, which shall not be forgiven in the world nor out of the world, is in that ye commit murder wherein ye shed innocent blood, and assent unto my death, after ye have received my new and everlasting covenant, saith the Lord God;

and he that abideth not this law can in nowise enter into my glory, but shall be damned, saith the Lord.

The law of the priesthood

²⁸I am the Lord thy God, and will give unto thee the law of my Holy Priesthood, as was ordained by me and my Father before the world was.

²⁹Abraham received all things, whatsoever he received, by revelation and commandment, by my word,^a saith the Lord, and hath entered into his exaltation and sitteth upon his throne.^b ³⁰Abraham received promises concerning his seed, and of the fruit of his loins^c—from whose loins ye are, namely, my servant Joseph^d—which were to continue so long as they were in the world; and as touching Abraham and his seed, out of the world they should continue; both in the world and out of the world should they continue as innumerable as the stars; or, if ye were to count the sand upon the seashore ye could not number them. ³¹This promise is yours also, because ye are of Abraham, and the promise was made unto Abraham; and by this law is the continuation of the works of my Father, wherein he glorifieth himself. ³²Go ye, therefore, and do the works of Abraham; enter ye into my law and ye shall be saved. ³³But if ye enter not into my law ye cannot receive the promise of my Father, which he made unto Abraham.

³⁴God commanded Abraham, and Sarah gave Hagar to Abraham to wife.^e And why did she do it? Because this was the law; and from Hagar sprang many people.^f This, therefore, was fulfilling, among other things, the promises. ³⁵Was Abraham, therefore, under condemnation? Verily I say unto you, Nay; for I, the Lord, commanded it.

³⁶Abraham was commanded to offer his son Isaac;^g nevertheless, it was written: Thou shalt not kill.^h Abraham, however, did not refuse, and it was accounted unto him for righteousness.

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things than that which they were commanded, they have entered into their exaltation, according to the promises, and sit upon thrones, and are not angels but are gods.^a

³⁸David also received many wives and concubines, and also Solomon and Moses my servants,^b as also many others of my servants,^c from the beginning of creation until this time; and in nothing did they sin save in those things which they received not of me. ³⁹David's wives and concubines were given unto him of me, by the hand of Nathan, my servant,^d and others of the prophets^e who had the keys of this power; and in none of these things did he sin against me save in the case of Uriah and his wife;^f and, therefore he hath fallen from his exaltation, and received his portion; and he shall not inherit them out of the world, for I gave them unto another, saith the Lord.

⁴⁵For I have conferred upon you the keys and power of the priesthood,^a wherein I restore all things, and make known unto you all things in due time. ⁴⁶And verily, verily, I say unto you, that whatsoever you seal on earth shall be sealed in heaven; and whatsoever you bind on earth, in my name and by my word, saith the Lord, it shall be eternally bound in the heavens; and whosesoever sins you remit on earth shall be retained in heaven. ⁴⁷And again, verily I say, whomsoever you bless I will bless, and whomsoever you curse I will curse, saith the Lord; for I, the Lord, am thy God.

⁵⁷Verily, I say unto you: A commandment I give unto mine handmaid, Emma Smith, your wife, whom I have given unto you, that she stay herself and partake not of that which I commanded you to offer unto her; for I did it, saith the Lord, to prove you all, as I did Abraham, and that I might require an offering at your hand, by covenant and sacrifice. ⁵²And let mine handmaid, Emma Smith, receive all those that have been given unto my servant Joseph, and who are virtuous and pure before me; and those who are not pure, and have said they were pure, shall be destroyed, ^d saith

the Lord God. ⁵³For I am the Lord thy God, and ye shall obey my voice; and I give unto my servant Joseph that he shall be made ruler over many things; for he hath been faithful over a few things, and from henceforth I will strengthen him.

⁵⁴And I command mine handmaid, Emma Smith, to abide and cleave unto my servant Joseph, and to none else. But if she will not abide this commandment she shall be destroyed, saith the Lord; for I am the Lord thy God, and will destroy her if she abide not in my law. ⁵⁵But if she will not abide this commandment, then shall my servant Joseph do all things for her, even as he hath said; and I will bless him and multiply him and give unto him an hundredfold in this world, of fathers and mothers, brothers and sisters, houses and lands, wives and children, and crowns of eternal lives in the eternal worlds.

⁵⁶And again, verily I say, let mine handmaid forgive my servant Joseph his trespasses; and then shall she be forgiven her trespasses, wherein she has trespassed against me; and I, the Lord thy God, will bless her, and multiply her, and make her heart to rejoice.

⁵⁷And again, I say, let not my servant Joseph put his property out of his hands, lest an enemy come and destroy him; for Satan seeketh to destroy; for I am the Lord thy God, and he is my servant; and behold, and lo, I am with him, as I was with Abraham, thy father, even unto his exaltation and glory.

The law of Sarah

⁵⁸Now, as touching the law of the priesthood, there are many things pertaining thereunto. ⁵⁹Verily, if a man be called of my Father, as was Aaron, by mine own voice, and by the voice of him that sent me, and I have endowed him with the keys of the power of this priesthood, if he do anything in my name, and according to my law and by my word, he will not commit sin, and I will justify him. ⁶⁰Let no one, therefore, set on my servant Joseph; for I will justify him; for he shall do the sacrifice which I require at his hands for his transgressions, saith the Lord your God.

⁶¹And again, as pertaining to the law of the priesthood—if any man espouse a virgin, and desire to espouse another, and the first give her consent, and if he espouse the second, and they are virgins, and have vowed to no other man, then is he justified; he cannot commit adultery for they are given unto him; for he cannot commit adultery with that that belongeth

unto him and to no one else. ⁶²And if he have ten virgins given unto him by this law, he cannot commit adultery, for they belong to him, and they are given unto him; therefore is he justified. ⁶³But if one or either of the ten virgins, after she is espoused, shall be with another man, she has committed adultery, and shall be destroyed; for they are given unto him to multiply and replenish the earth, according to my commandment, ^a and to fulfil the promise which was given by my Father before the foundation of the world, ^b and for their exaltation in the eternal worlds, that they may bear the souls of men; for herein is the work of my Father continued, that he may be glorified.

⁶⁴And again, verily, verily, I say unto you, if any man have a wife, who holds the keys of this power, and he teaches unto her the law of my priesthood, as pertaining to these things, then shall she believe and administer unto him, or she shall be destroyed, saith the Lord your God; for I will destroy her; for I will magnify my name upon all those who receive and abide in my law. ⁶⁵Therefore, it shall be lawful in me, if she receive not this law, for him to receive all things whatsoever I, the Lord his God, will give unto him, because she did not believe and administer unto him according to my word; and she then becomes the transgressor; and he is exempt from the law of Sarah, who administered unto Abraham according to the law when I commanded Abraham to take Hagar to wife.⁶

 66 And now, as pertaining to this law, verily, Verily, I say unto you, I will reveal more unto you, hereafter; therefore, let this suffice for the present. Behold, I am Alpha and Omega. Amen. d

GOVERNMENTS AND LAWS August 1835 ≈ Kirtland, Ohio 134

We believe that governments were instituted of God for the benefit of man; and that he holds men accountable for their acts in relation to them, both in making laws and administering them, for the good and safety of society.

²We believe that no government can exist in peace, except such laws are framed and held inviolate as will secure to each individual the free exercise of conscience, the right and control of property, and the protection of life.

³We believe that all governments necessarily require civil officers and magistrates to enforce the laws of the same; and that such as will administer the law in equity and justice should be sought for and upheld by the voice of the people if a republic, or the will of the sovereign.

⁴We believe that religion is instituted of God; and that men are amenable to him, and to him only, for the exercise of it, unless their religious opinions prompt them to infringe upon the rights and liberties of others; but we do not believe that human law has a right to interfere in prescribing rules of worship to bind the consciences of men, nor dictate forms for public or private devotion; that the civil magistrate should restrain crime, but never control conscience; should punish guilt, but never suppress the freedom of the soul.

⁵We believe that all men are bound to sustain and uphold the respective governments in which they reside, while protected in their inherent and inalienable rights by the laws of such governments; and that sedition and rebellion are unbecoming every citizen thus protected, and should be punished accordingly; and that all governments have a right to enact such laws as in their own judgments are best calculated to secure the public interest; at the same time, however, holding sacred the freedom of conscience.

⁶We believe that every man should be honored in his station, rulers and magistrates as such, being placed for the protection of the innocent and the punishment of the guilty; and that to the laws all men show respect and deference, as without them peace and harmony would be supplanted by anarchy and terror; human laws being instituted for the express purpose of regulating our interests as individuals and nations, between man and man; and divine laws given of heaven, prescribing rules on spiritual concerns, for faith and worship, both to be answered by man to his Maker.

We believe that rulers, states, and governments have a right, and are bound to enact laws for the protection of all citizens in the free exercise of their religious belief; but we do not believe that they have a right in justice to deprive citizens of this privilege, or proscribe them in their opinions, so long as a regard and reverence are shown to the laws and such religious opinions do not justify sedition nor conspiracy.

⁸We believe that the commission of crime should be punished according to the nature of the offense; that murder, treason, robbery, theft, and the

breach of the general peace, in all respects, should be punished according to their criminality and their tendency to evil among men, by the laws of that government in which the offense is committed; and for the public peace and tranquility all men should step forward and use their ability in bringing offenders against good laws to punishment.

⁹We do not believe it just to mingle religious influence with civil government, whereby one religious society is fostered and another proscribed in its spiritual privileges, and the individual rights of its members, as citizens, denied.

¹⁰We believe that all religious societies have a right to deal with their members for disorderly conduct, according to the rules and regulations of such societies; provided that such dealings be for fellowship and good standing; but we do not believe that any religious society has authority to try men on the right of property or life, to take from them this world's goods, or to put them in jeopardy of either life or limb, or to inflict any physical punishment upon them. They can only excommunicate them from their society, and withdraw from them their fellowship.

¹⁷We believe that men should appeal to the civil law for redress of all wrongs and grievances, where personal abuse is inflicted or the right of property or character infringed, where such laws exist as will protect the same; but we believe that all men are justified in defending themselves, their friends, and property, and the government, from the unlawful assaults and encroachments of all persons in times of exigency, where immediate appeal cannot be made to the laws, and relief afforded.

¹²We believe it just to preach the gospel to the nations of the earth, and warn the righteous to save themselves from the corruption of the world; but we do not believe it right to interfere with bond-servants, neither preach the gospel to, nor baptize them contrary to the will and wish of their masters, nor to meddle with or influence them in the least to cause them to be dissatisfied with their situations in this life, thereby jeopardizing the lives of men; such interference we believe to be unlawful and unjust, and dangerous to the peace of every government allowing human beings to be held in servitude.

THE MARTYRDOM

After June 1844 ← Nauvoo, Illinois

135

To seal the testimony of this book and the Book of Mormon, we announce the martyrdom of Joseph Smith the Prophet, and Hyrum Smith the Patriarch. They were shot in Carthage jail, on the 27th of June, 1844, about five o'clock p.m., by an armed mob—painted black—of from 150 to 200 persons. Hyrum was shot first and fell calmly, exclaiming: *I am a dead man!* Joseph leaped from the window, and was shot dead in the attempt, exclaiming: *O Lord my God!* They were both shot after they were dead, in a brutal manner, and both received four balls. John Taylor and Willard Richards, two of the Twelve, were the only persons in the room at the time; the former was wounded in a savage manner with four balls, but has since recovered; the latter, through the providence of God, escaped, without even a hole in his robe.

Joseph Smith, the Prophet and Seer of the Lord, has done more, save Jesus only, for the salvation of men in this world, than any other man that ever lived in it. In the short space of twenty years, he has brought forth the Book of Mormon, which he translated by the gift and power of God, and has been the means of publishing it on two continents; has sent the fulness of the everlasting gospel, which it contained, to the four quarters of the earth; has brought forth the revelations and commandments which compose this book of Doctrine and Covenants, and many other wise documents and instructions^b for the benefit of the children of men; gathered many thousands of the Latter-day Saints,^c founded a great city,^d and left a fame and name that cannot be slain. He lived great, and he died great in the eyes of God and his people; and like most of the Lord's anointed in ancient times,^e has sealed his mission and his works with his own blood; and so has his brother Hyrum. In life they were not divided, and in death they were not separated!

morning; I have a conscience void of offense towards God, and towards all men. I shall die innocent, and it shall yet be said of me—he was murdered in cold blood."—

The same morning, after Hyrum had made ready to go—shall it be said to the slaughter? yes, for so it was—he read the following paragraph, near the close of the twelfth chapter of Ether,^a in the Book of Mormon, and turned down the leaf upon it:

⁵And it came to pass that I prayed unto the Lord that he would give unto the Gentiles grace, that they might have charity.

And it came to pass that the Lord said unto me: If they have not charity it mattereth not unto thee, thou hast been faithful; wherefore thy garments shall be made clean. And because thou hast seen thy weakness, thou shalt be made strong, even unto the sitting down in the place which I have prepared in the mansions of my Father.

And now I... bid farewell unto the Gentiles; yea, and also unto my brethren whom I love, until we shall meet before the judgment-seat of Christ, where all men shall know that my garments are not spotted with your blood.

The testators are now dead, and their testament is in force. ^b Hyrum Smith was forty-four years old in February, 1844, and Joseph Smith was thirty-eight in December, 1843; and henceforward their names will be classed among the martyrs of religion; and the reader in every nation will be reminded that the Book of Mormon, and this book of Doctrine and Covenants of the church, cost the best blood of the nineteenth century to bring them forth for the salvation of a ruined world; and that if the fire can scathe a green tree for the glory of God, how easy it will burn up the dry trees to purify the vineyard of corruption. ^c

They lived for glory; they died for glory; and glory is their eternal reward. From age to age shall their names go down to posterity as gems for the sanctified. ⁷They were innocent of any crime, as they had often been

proved before, and were only confined in jail by the conspiracy of traitors and wicked men;

- and their *innocent blood* on the floor of Carthage jail is a broad seal affixed to "Mormonism" that cannot be rejected by any court on earth,
- and their *innocent blood* on the escutcheon of the State of Illinois, with the broken faith of the State as pledged by the governor, is a witness to the truth of the everlasting gospel that all the world cannot impeach;
- and their *innocent blood* on the banner of liberty, and on the *magna charta* of the United States, is an ambassador for the religion of Jesus Christ, that will touch the hearts of honest men among all nations;
- and their *innocent blood*, with the innocent blood of all the martyrs under the altar that John saw,^c will cry unto the Lord of Hosts till he avenges that blood on the earth.



Under his leadership, the saints migrated to the Rocky Mountains and formed the state of Utah. From there, the Church continued to be guided by successive prophets and spread throughout the world.

THE CAMP OF ISRAEL

14 January 1847 Winter Quarters, west bank of the Missouri River, near what is now Florence, Nebraska

¹The Word and Will of the Lord concerning the Camp of Israel^a in their journeyings to the West:

Organizing into companies

²Let all the people of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and those who journey with them, be organized into companies, with a covenant and promise to keep all the commandments and statutes of the Lord our God. ³Let the companies be organized with captains of hundreds, captains of fifties, and captains of tens, ^b with a president and his two counselors at their head, under the direction of the Twelve Apostles. ⁴And this shall be our covenant—that we will walk in all the ordinances of the Lord. ⁵Let each company provide themselves with all the teams, wagons, provisions, clothing, and other necessaries for the journey, that they can.

⁶When the companies are organized let them go to with their might, to prepare for those who are to tarry. ⁷Let each company, with their captains and presidents, decide how many can go next spring; then choose out a sufficient number of able-bodied and expert men, to take teams, seeds, and farming utensils, to go as pioneers to prepare for putting in spring crops. ⁸Let each company bear an equal proportion, according to the dividend of their property, in taking the poor, the widows, the fatherless, and the families of those who have gone into the army, a that the cries of the widow and the fatherless come not up into the ears of the Lord against this people. Let each company prepare houses, and fields for raising grain, for those who are to remain behind this season; and this is the will of the Lord concerning his people. ¹⁰Let every man use all his influence and property to remove this people to the place where the Lord shall locate a stake of Zion. ¹¹And if ye do this with a pure heart, in all faithfulness, ye shall be blessed; you shall be blessed in your flocks, and in your herds, and in your fields, and in your houses, and in your families.

way and do as I have told you, and fear not thine enemies; for they shall not have power to stop my work. ¹⁸Zion shall be redeemed in mine own due time. ¹⁹And if any man shall seek to build up himself, and seeketh not my counsel, he shall have no power, and his folly shall be made manifest.

Conduct

²⁰Seek ye; and keep all your pledges one with another; and covet not that which is thy brother's. ^{a 27}Keep yourselves from evil to take the name of the Lord in vain, ^b for I am the Lord your God, even the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob. ^{c 22}I am he who led the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt; ^d and my arm is stretched out ^e in the last days, to save my people Israel.

²³Cease to contend one with another; cease to speak evil one of another. ²⁴Cease drunkenness; and let your words tend to edifying one another. ²⁵If thou borrowest of thy neighbor, ^f thou shalt restore that which thou hast borrowed; and if thou canst not repay then go straightway and tell thy neighbor, lest he condemn thee. ²⁶If thou shalt find that which thy neighbor has lost, thou shalt make diligent search till thou shalt deliver it to him again. ²⁷Thou shalt be diligent in preserving what thou hast, that thou mayest be a wise steward; for it is the free gift of the Lord thy God, and thou art his steward.

²⁸If thou art merry, praise the Lord with singing, with music, with dancing, and with a prayer of praise and thanksgiving. ²⁹If thou art sorrowful, call on the Lord thy God with supplication, that your souls may be joyful.

³⁰Fear not thine enemies, for they are in mine hands and I will do my pleasure with them. ³¹My people must be tried in all things, that they may be prepared to receive the glory that I have for them, even the glory of Zion; and he that will not bear chastisement is not worthy of my kingdom. ³²Let him that is ignorant learn wisdom by humbling himself and calling

upon the Lord his God, that his eyes may be opened that he may see, and his ears opened that he may hear; ³³For my Spirit is sent forth into the world to enlighten the humble and contrite, and to the condemnation of the ungodly.

³⁴Thy brethren have rejected you and your testimony, even the nation that has driven you out; ³⁵And now cometh the day of their calamity, even the days of sorrow, like a woman that is taken in travail; and their sorrow shall be great unless they speedily repent, yea, very speedily. ³⁶For they killed the prophets, and them that were sent unto them; and they have shed innocent blood, which crieth from the ground against them.

³⁷Therefore, marvel not at these things, for ye are not yet pure; ye can not yet bear my glory; but ye shall behold it if ye are faithful in keeping all my words that I have given you, from the days of Adam to Abraham,^a from Abraham to Moses,^b from Moses to Jesus and his apostles,^c and from Jesus and his apostles to Joseph Smith,^d whom I did call upon by mine angels, my ministering servants, and by mine own voice out of the heavens,^e to bring forth my work; ³⁸Which foundation he did lay, and was faithful; and I took him to myself.^f ³⁹Many have marveled because of his death; but it was needful that he should seal his testimony with his blood, that he might be honored and the wicked might be condemned.^g ⁴⁰Have I not delivered you from your enemies, only in that I have left a witness of my name?

Closing

⁴¹Now, therefore, hearken, O ye people of my church; and ye elders listen together; you have received my kingdom. ⁴²Be diligent in keeping all my commandments, lest judgments come upon you, and your faith fail you, and your enemies triumph over you.

So no more at present. Amen and Amen.

The heavens were opened upon us, and I beheld the celestial kingdom of God, and the glory thereof, whether in the body or out I cannot tell.^a ²I saw the transcendent beauty of the gate through which the heirs of that kingdom will enter, which was like unto circling flames of fire; ³Also the blazing throne of God, whereon was seated the Father and the Son. ⁴I saw the beautiful streets of that kingdom, which had the appearance of being paved with gold. ⁵I saw Father Adam^b and Abraham;^c and my father and my mother; my brother Alvin, that has long since slept;^d ⁶And marveled how it was that he had obtained an inheritance in that kingdom, seeing that he had departed this life before the Lord had set his hand to gather Israel the second time, and had not been baptized for the remission of sins.

⁷Thus came the voice of the Lord unto me, saying: All who have died without a knowledge of this gospel, who would have received it if they had been permitted to tarry, shall be heirs of the celestial kingdom of God; ⁸Also all that shall die henceforth without a knowledge of it, who would have received it with all their hearts, shall be heirs of that kingdom; ⁹For I, the Lord, will judge all men according to their works, according to the desire of their hearts.

On the third of October, in the year nineteen hundred and eighteen, I sat in my room pondering over the scriptures;
And reflecting upon the great atoning sacrifice that was made by the Son of God, for the redemption of the world; And the great and wonderful love made manifest by the Father and the Son in the coming of the Redeemer

into the world; ⁴That through his atonement, and by obedience to the principles of the gospel, mankind might be saved.

⁵While I was thus engaged, my mind reverted to the writings of the apostle Peter,^a to the primitive saints scattered abroad throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, and other parts of Asia,^b where the gospel had been preached after the crucifixion of the Lord.^c ⁶I opened the Bible and read the third and fourth chapters of the first epistle of Peter, and as I read I was greatly impressed, more than I had ever been before, with the following passages:

⁷"For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit: ⁸"By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison; ⁹"Which sometime were disobedient, when once the long-suffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water." (1 Peter 3:18–20.)

¹⁰"For for this cause was the gospel preached also to them that are dead, that they might be judged according to men in the flesh, but live according to God in the spirit." (1 Peter 4:6.)

¹⁵I beheld that they were filled with joy and gladness, and were rejoicing together because the day of their deliverance was at hand. ¹⁶They were assembled awaiting the advent of the Son of God into the spirit world, to declare their redemption from the bands of death. ¹⁷Their sleeping dust was to be restored unto its perfect frame, bone to his bone, and the sinews and the flesh upon them, the spirit and the body to be united never again to be divided, ^a that they might receive a fulness of joy. ^b

God preached unto the spirits in prison, who sometime were disobedient, when once the long-suffering of God waited in the days of Noah^a—and how it was possible for him to preach to those spirits and perform the necessary labor among them in so short a time.

²⁹And as I wondered, my eyes were opened, and my understanding quickened, and I perceived that the Lord went not in person among the wicked and the disobedient who had rejected the truth, to teach them; ³⁰But behold, from among the righteous, he organized his forces and appointed messengers, clothed with power and authority, and commissioned them to go forth and carry the light of the gospel to them that were in darkness, even to all the spirits of men; and thus was the gospel preached to the dead.^b ³⁷And the chosen messengers went forth to declare the acceptable day of the Lord and proclaim liberty to the captives who were bound, even unto all who would repent of their sins and receive the gospel.

³²Thus was the gospel preached to those^c who had died in their sins, without a knowledge of the truth, or in transgression, having rejected the prophets. ³³These were taught faith in God, repentance from sin, vicarious baptism for the remission of sins, the gift of the Holy Ghost by the laying on of hands, ^d ³⁴And all other principles of the gospel that were necessary for them to know in order to qualify themselves that they might be judged according to men in the flesh, but live according to God in the spirit. ^e ³⁵And so it was made known among the dead, both small and great, ^f the unrighteous as well as the faithful, that redemption had been wrought through the sacrifice of the Son of God upon the cross.

³⁶Thus was it made known that our Redeemer spent his time during his sojourn in the world of spirits, instructing and preparing the faithful spirits of the prophets who had testified of him in the flesh; ³⁷That they might carry the message of redemption unto all the dead, unto whom he could not go personally, because of their rebellion and transgression, that they through the ministration of his servants might also hear his words.

been promised by the Lord,^a and be partakers of all blessings which were held in reserve for them that love him.

⁵³The Prophet Joseph Smith, and my father, Hyrum Smith, Brigham Young, John Taylor, Wilford Woodruff, and other choice spirits who were reserved to come forth in the fulness of times to take part in laying the foundations of the great Latter-day work, ⁵⁴Including the building of the temples^b and the performance of ordinances therein for the redemption of the dead,^c were also in the spirit world. ⁵⁵I observed that they were also among the noble and great ones who were chosen in the beginning to be rulers in the Church of God. ⁵⁶Even before they were born,^d they, with many others, received their first lessons in the world of spirits and were prepared to come forth in the due time of the Lord to labor in his vineyard for the salvation of the souls of men.

⁵⁷I beheld that the faithful elders of this dispensation, when they depart from mortal life, continue their labors in the preaching of the gospel of repentance and redemption, through the sacrifice of the Only Begotten Son of God, among those who are in darkness and under the bondage of sin in the great world of the spirits of the dead. ⁵⁸The dead who repent will be redeemed, through obedience to the ordinances of the house of God, ⁵⁹And after they have paid the penalty of their transgressions, and are washed clean, shall receive a reward according to their works, for they are heirs of salvation.

¹To Whom It May Concern:



²Press dispatches having been sent for political purposes, from Salt Lake City, which have been widely published, to the effect that the Utah Commission, in their recent report to the Secretary of the Interior, allege that plural marriages^a are still being solemnized and that forty or more such marriages have been contracted in Utah since last June or during the past year, also that in public discourses the leaders of the Church have taught, encouraged and urged the continuance of the practice of polygamy—

³I, therefore, as President of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, do hereby, in the most solemn manner, declare that these charges are false. We are not teaching polygamy or plural marriage, nor permitting any person to enter into its practice, and I deny that either forty or any other number of plural marriages have during that period been solemnized in our Temples or in any other place in the Territory.

⁴One case has been reported, in which the parties allege that the marriage was performed in the Endowment House, in Salt Lake City, in the Spring of 1889, but I have not been able to learn who performed the ceremony; whatever was done in this matter was without my knowledge. In consequence of this alleged occurrence the Endowment House was, by my instructions, taken down without delay.

⁵Inasmuch as laws have been enacted by Congress forbidding plural marriages, ^b which laws have been pronounced constitutional by the court of last resort, I hereby declare my intention to submit to those laws, ^c and to use my influence with the members of the Church over which I preside to have them do likewise.

[®]There is nothing in my teachings to the Church or in those of my associates, during the time specified, ^d which can be reasonably construed to inculcate or encourage polygamy; and when any Elder of the Church

has used language which appeared to convey any such teaching, he has been promptly reproved. And I now publicly declare that my advice to the Latter-day Saints is to refrain from contracting any marriage forbidden by the law of the land.

⁴The Lord has told me to ask the Latter-day Saints a question, and He also told me that if they would listen to what I said to them and answer the question put to them, by the Spirit and power of God, they would all answer alike, and they would all believe alike with regard to this matter.

The question is this: Which is the wisest course for the Latter-day Saints to pursue—to continue to attempt to practice plural marriage, with the laws of the nation against it and the opposition of sixty millions of people, and at the cost of the confiscation and loss of all the Temples, and the stopping of all the ordinances therein, both for the living and the dead, and the imprisonment of the First Presidency and Twelve and the heads of families in the Church, and the confiscation of personal property of the people (all of which of themselves would stop the practice); or, after doing and suffering what we have through our adherence to this principle to cease the practice and submit to the law, and through doing so leave the Prophets, Apostles and fathers at home, so that they can instruct the people and attend to the duties of the Church, and also leave the Temples in the hands of the Saints, so that they can attend to the ordinances of the Gospel, both for the living and the dead?

"The Lord showed me by vision and revelation exactly what would take place if we did not stop this practice. If we had not stopped it, you would have had no use for . . . any of the men in this temple at Logan; for all ordinances would be stopped throughout the land of Zion. Confusion would reign throughout Israel, and many men would be made prisoners. This trouble would have come upon the whole Church, and we should have been compelled to stop the practice. Now, the question is, whether it should be stopped in this manner, or in the way the Lord has manifested to us, and leave our Prophets and Apostles and fathers free men, and the temples in the hands of the people, so that the dead may be redeemed. A large number has already been delivered from the prison house in the spirit world by this people, and shall the work go on or stop? This is the question I lay before the Latter-day Saints. You have to judge for yourselves. I want you to answer it for yourselves. I shall not answer it; but I say to you that that is exactly the condition we as a people would have been in had we not taken the course we have.

^{7"}... I saw exactly what would come to pass if there was not something done. I have had this spirit upon me for a long time. But I want to say this: I should have let all the temples go out of our hands; I should have gone to prison myself, and let every other man go there, had not the God of heaven commanded me to do what I did do; and when the hour came that I was commanded to do that, it was all clear to me. I went before the Lord, and I wrote what the Lord told me to write. . . .

⁶"I leave this with you, for you to contemplate and consider. The Lord is at work with us" (Cache Stake conference, Logan, Utah, Sunday, 1 November 1891; reported in the *Deseret Weekly*, 14 November 1891).

⁶⁴Now I will tell you what was manifested to me and what the Son of God performed in this thing. . . . All these things would have come to pass, as God Almighty lives, had not that Manifesto been given. Therefore, the Son of God felt disposed to have that thing presented to the Church and to the world for purposes in his own mind. The Lord had decreed the establishment of Zion. Kimball extending priesthood and temple blessings to all worthy male members of the Church. President Kimball has asked that I advise the conference that after he had received this revelation, which came to him after extended meditation and prayer in the sacred rooms of the holy temple, he presented it to his counselors, who accepted it and approved it. It was then presented to the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles, who unanimously approved it, and was subsequently presented to all other General Authorities, who likewise approved it unanimously.

⁴President Kimball has asked that I now read this letter:

⁵June 8, 1978

To all general and local priesthood officers of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints throughout the world:

Dear Brethren:

⁶As we have witnessed the expansion of the work of the Lord over the earth, we have been grateful that people of many nations have responded to the message of the restored gospel, and have joined the Church in ever-increasing numbers. This, in turn, has inspired us with a desire to extend to every worthy member of the Church all of the privileges and blessings which the gospel affords.

⁷Aware of the promises made by the prophets and presidents of the Church who have preceded us^c that at some time,

Accordingly, all worthy male members of the Church may be ordained to the priesthood without regard for race or color. Priesthood leaders are instructed to follow the policy of carefully interviewing all candidates for ordination to either the Aaronic or the Melchizedek Priesthood to insure that they meet the established standards for worthiness.^a

⁹We declare with soberness that the Lord has now made known his will for the blessing of all his children throughout the earth who will hearken to the voice of his authorized servants, and prepare themselves to receive every blessing of the gospel.

APPENDIX 2 CHRONOLOGICAL READING MAP

T he purpose of a chronological reading map is to enable people to read the scriptures in chronological order, even when doing so requires jumping back and forth between passages or even between different books of scripture.

The Doctrine and Covenants, Joseph Smith—History, and the Articles of Faith

This diagram shows the relationship between the Doctrine and Covenants, Joseph Smith—History, and the Articles of Faith (the latter two books are contained in the Pearl of Great Price). By beginning at the top and following the arrows between books, one can read the entire content of all three books, in roughly the chronological sequence in which the events and revelations occurred. This sequence is mostly correct but is subject to slight revision as research continues to come forth.


The sections of the Doctrine and Covenants are for the most part numbered in chronological, but there are a few exceptions. Those exceptions are shaded yellow in the diagram, and they are the ones which must be read out of numerical sequence in order to be read in chronological order. They correspond to the yellow-shaded sections in the scripture text throughout this book (which are also shaded yellow in the table of contents and in Appendix 4: Table of Information for Sections).

Of the yellow-shaded sections, those which also have blue numbers are major exceptions (a year or more out of place). Those with regular black numbers are minor exceptions (less than three months out of place); they usually only need to be swapped with an adjacent section to be in the right sequence.


